MARRATIVE SUMMARY

During January 1969, VMA-227 flow 993.6 hours and 939 serties of which 973.7 hours and 920 serties were flown in support of combat eperations in the Republic of Vietnam. The squadron delivered 1353.90 tens of aviation ordnames with the highest daily total being 76.72 tens delivered on 20 January.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. ADMINISTRATION

- a. Personnel strength varied throughout the month ending with a decrease in personnel. Four Naval Aviators were joined and four were transferred. Four enlisted were joined and ten were transferred.
- b. The Civil Affairs Program supported 57 South Vistnamese children during January by providing scholarships. Khuong Quang school was given sement for the repair of its roof, a large first aid bex and an 6°x10° class picture which had been taken by a member of the squadren. Khuong My school was given more materials for the contruction of its sanitary teilot and three sacks of whitewash base, enough to repaint the exterior of the school. Khuong Hiep school also received three sacks of whitewash base. Khuong Bai school was given enough weed to build school desks for fifty students. Members of the squadren also accompanied the Group Civic Action Team on MEDCAPS to Khuong Vinh and My Sanh hamlets.
- o. Three people were given Good Conduct Awards and Corporal W. J. TEAGLE was awarded a Meriterious Mast for his devetion to duty and outstanding professional attitude.

d. Personnel Promotions.

- (1) W. E. FORTER received a Meriterious Combat promotion to Gunnery Sergeant.
 - (2) J. A. SHAVERS was promoted to Corporal.
 - (3) Lance Corporal R. R. DEBNIS was premeted to his present rank.

2. OPERATIONS

- a. VMA-223 conducted air operations on each day of January in support of I Corps, II Corps and 7th Air Force targets. Operations and Units supported are listed in Part IV.
- b. At the end of January 1969, VMA-223°s accident free hours totaled 3652.7. The last eperational accident eccurred on 21 Gotober 1968.

- o. NP-21, Buno 151097, was lost at sea due to battle damage received on 24 January during a close air support mission in support of the 1st Marine Division near Thong Buo. Captain Michael P. GREEN, the pilot, successfully ejected and was picked up by a U.S. Mary Swift Boat. Captain GREEN sustained no injuries in the incident.
- d. Two Eaval Aviators assigned to VMA-223 have ever 500 combat missions, one has ever 400, six have ever 500, four have ever 200, and eight have ever 100.

o. Training

- (1) Four Naval Aviators attended Jungle Environmental Survival Training (JEST) School at Cubi Point.
 - (2) Two Officers attended 3M School at Banang.
- (3) One Officer and one Emlisted attended Basic Embarkation School at Camp Hanson, Okinawa.

3. MAINTENANCE

a. The Squadron had a daily average of 19.6 aircraft on hand, 14.25 daily availability and averaged 44.7 hours per sireraft for the month for 112.2% utilization.
