PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

From 1 April to 14 April VMA(AW)225 continued its' missions of attacking and destroying surface targets under all weather conditions. The Squadron flew 210.5 combat hours and completed 150 combat missions, dropping 549.503 tons of ordnance resulting in BDA of: 18 trucks destroyed, 46 secondary explosions, 28 secondary fires, 7 structures destroyed, and two tunnels uncovered.

On 1 April Brigadier General E. H. SIMMONS, Assistant Division Commander, 1st Marine Division, toured the Squadron accompanied by LtCol. J. A. MANZIONE, the Squadron Commanding Officer.

On 5 April LtCol. MANZIONE briefed members of the General Accounting Office on Squadron operations at a static display.

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Surface to Air Missiles were fired at one Squadron aircraft on 12 April. The crew took appropriate defensive action and observed 2 explosions at some distance from the aircraft. Visibility was handicapped by bad weather as numerous thunderstorms were in the area. The crew was flown to Saigon on 13 April to debrief 7th Air Force Intelligence.

Squadron operations were reduced on 1 April to permit the Squadron to prepare its aircraft, personnel, and equipment for the forthcoming redeployment. The reduction of scheduled sorties was in line with the President's policy for the overall reduction of Free World Forces and especially Marines in RVN.

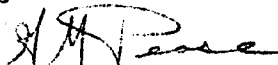
