- b. Colonel W. G. HYNDIS, officer in charge of All Weather Attack, 7th Air Force visited the squadron area on 24 May and flew an orientation flight on 25 May 1967.

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Part II - Narrative Summary

The month started out with a change of command ceremony in which LtCol E. E. JACOBSON relieved LtCol H. WOLF.

During May the emphasis remained on Rolling Thunder missions. These missions were expanded to include targets in Route Packages V, VIA, and VIB. Both coordinated and single plane strikes were flown. During the cease fire on Buddha's birthday radar reconnaissance flights were flown over North Vietnam.

Maintenance efforts during the month concentrated on maintaining full systems aircraft for the Rolling Thunder and Tally Ho missions. In addition modifications were made in the aircraft to give the pilot an instant manual backup in the event of a weapons release malfunction during DIANE automatic attacks and a beacon in the aircraft to increase the range of TPQ and MSQ ground controlled radar bombing.

Col. W. G. HYND, USAF, the officer in charge of All Weather Attack for the 7th Air Force and thus directly responsible for fragging the Rolling Thunder missions, visited the squadron for an A6A briefing and orientation flight.

Two squadron officers received Distinguished Flying Crosses for prowess in air attacks flown against the enemy in November 1966.

The squadron continued to suffer generator problems in the living areas and avionics air conditioner problems in the working area.

In athletics the squadron retained its lead in the Commanding Officer's Trophy race.

Part III - Significant Events

1. Personnel. Personnel in Occupational Field (OF) 6600 were redesignated into OF 6200. Four officers and six enlisted were transferred and one officer and one enlisted joined. One major, one staff sergeant, five corporals and seven lance corporals were promoted to present rank.

2. Administration. N/A.

3. Awards. Aircrews were awarded 34 air medals during May (see Appendix B, Tabs 1 and 2). Capt Robert L. OETTING and CWO Douglas E. WILSON were awarded Distinguished Flying Crosses, for action against the enemy in November 1966. Two officers received Certificates of Achievement for 100 missions.

4. Casualties. None.

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5. Civic Action. Used roofing material was obtained from the USO for civil affairs and was distributed to the needy in the village of Hoa Vang. Work continued on the dispensary project in this village. Enlisted members of VMA(AW) 242 aided in the accumulation and distribution of roofing materials and in screening in the dispensary.

6. Morale/Welfare Programs. Fifteen squadron members are playing on the fast pitch softball team. The squadron won the MAG-11 pocket billiards tournament. Six volleyball players from the squadron team which won the MAG-11 Championship were chosen to play on the MAG-11 All-Star team which won the 1st MAW Championship on 31 May.

Besides squadron participation in fishing trips and in-country R&R, forty-three squadron members went on out-of-country R&R. A squadron party was held 20 May for all enlisted personnel.

7. Informational Services. A total of 326 Fleet Home Town News releases were submitted including 314 roster story, six promotions, two Distinguished Flying Cross awards plus feature stories, two "10,000th ton of ordnance dropped" plus feature stories, and "two 2000th night combat sortie" plus feature stories.

8. Intelligence/Counter Intelligence. The first radar photos of targets in Route Packages V, VIA, and VIB were received from VA-85 and VA-35, both Navy A6A squadrons, operating from Yankee Station.

These photos are being turned over to MAG-11 S-2 for inclusion in the deep Rolling Thunder target folders as rapidly as they can be analyzed and cataloged.

The excellent resolution in these scope pictures should be invaluable to the B/N since it gives him an actual reproduction of the target as seen on the radar scope. Study of this reproduction in the pre-strike preparation enables the crew to identify the exact target area rapidly, and the B/N to position his cursors precisely for the most accurate bomb release.

9. ECM. The squadron received additional ECM equipment on 7 May allowing a full set for each aircraft. Later in May however some ECM equipment was loaned to VMCJ-1 and VMA(AW) 533 thus necessitating switching ECM boxes between aircraft.

Two additional APR 27 missile warning devices were received, bringing the total held by the squadron to eight.

10. Photo. N/A

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11. Air Operations. VMA(AW) 242 flew 242 sorties, 219 of them at night for a total of 352.8 flight hours.

The squadron began flying missions into Route Packages IV, V, VIA, and VIB, during May in both coordinated and single plane strikes.

12. Air Defense/Control. N/A

15. Command Relationship/Command and Control. No change in May.?

16. NBC Warfare. N/A

17. Training. Aircrews received formal lectures on SAR posture and procedures in Route Packages IV, V, VIA, and VIB.

Four aircrew members attended JEST School at NAS Cubi Point. One officer attended registered publications school.

Formal enlisted training in the M-16 rifle was conducted by MAG-11.

Sixty SNCO's fired the pistol range and a gas chamber exercise was held; 89 men attending.

Formal enlisted training on General Military Subjects was begun on 31 May.

18. Logistics. See Appendix C.

19. Supply. N/A

20. Motor Transport. Average availability was 95 percent for six vehicles assigned.

21. Engineering. N/A

22. Maintenance. The first two weeks in May were spent modifying all aircraft with a dual water separator; used to remove all moisture from the air conditioning system and thereby prolonging up time of systems and increasing systems availability. The APN 154 radar beacon which increases the tracking range of the aircraft when flying TPQ or MSQ missions was installed in all aircraft, the APN 154 permits ground controlled bombing anywhere in I Corps.

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External air conditioning equipment, necessary to keep cool air running through the aircraft systems during maintenance, continued to be a major maintenance problem. The squadron operated without air conditioners about one third of the month.

The squadron received six new MERS and three TERS on 14 May and when adapters are received and installed on them a higher reliability factor is expected. All drop tanks have been checked out and are being used on Rolling Thunder missions, requiring extra fuel.

The corrosion control program of sending aircraft to NAS Cubi Point was reinstated.

Maintenance began modifying the ECP-66 on aircraft to give the pilot a "hot pickle" and thus the option to drop ordnance either automatically or manually utilizing the attack solution of the DIANE system.

A three month PAR date extension was granted for BuNo 152588.

Two aircraft received battle damage during May. BuNo 152607 received skin damage from undetermined source on May 18. The damage was noted after a deep Rolling Thunder mission in which several SAM's and heavy ground fire was directed at the aircraft.

On May 25 while on a Tally Ho mission BuNo 152604 received damage from an estimated .30 calibre round which entered the starboard wheel well, severing electrical and hydraulics lines.

23. Avionics. On 14 May, VMA(AW) 242 received an NR-5B electric driven air conditioner on loan from NAS Cubi Point. It was non RFI, although new. On 15 May it was repaired locally and is being set up to improve system maintenance. It should greatly enhance the avionics maintenance effort.

The last of the AN/APN-154, GCBS Beacons was installed in 242 A/C. This will give us the capability of longer range TPQ drops when necessary.

24. Base Development/Construction. A dust fence bordering the squadron living area was completed and a new floor was laid in the head on the flight line. Generator problems continued to plague the squadron as they have in the past six months. A request for commercial power has been submitted.

25. Communications/Electronics. N/A

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26. Ordnance. The squadron dropped its 10,000th ton of ordnance during the month of May. Total ordnance for May was 1041.50.

In May the squadron began utilizing the M117A1 750# bomb for the first time.

b. Significant problem areas directly relating to NORS percentage:

(1) During the month of May 62 NORS/G requisitions were initiated in addition to 27 unfilled NORS/G requisitions brought forward from the previous months. Of the 109 NORS/G requisitions for May, 11% were back ordered against over haul schedule and 3% were processed from contractors. This perpetuates an excessive supply reaction time.

3. Significant problem areas directly relating to NORM percentage:

Subj: Logistics Summary Report (Logsum)

a. The excessive NORM is primarily attributed to inadequate ground support equipment (Mobile Air Conditioners). The present available equipment is old and generally reassemble equipment salvaged from a junk yard. This dilapidated equipment, through constant maintenance and jury rigging delivers the bare minimum of cooling air for systems maintenance. The inadequate flow and temperature, constant shut down for repair or system components over heating is resulting in poor systems availability and precluding quality maintenance. An infinite number of black boxes cannot keep the A6A system airborne without adequate ground cooling for systems maintenance.

b. During the reporting period a total of about 50 MEEL components were in IMA per day, which no supply action is documented. This failure rate should decrease as a result of Water Separator Kits installed in the aircraft for the purification of the Air Conditioning System and preservation of MEEL components.

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PART II - Narrative Summary

June 1967 marked the seventh month and the halfway point of the squadron's thirteen month tour in Vietnam. Rolling Thunder missions both deep, in route packages IV, V, VIA, and VIB and Vinh and "Baby Thunders" to Route packages I, II, III, fragged by the 7th Air Force continued to monopolize the squadron Operations and Maintenance efforts. Maintenance and Avionics continued to suffer problems with Maintenance ground air conditioning and benches for work on computers and other avionics equipment.

In athletics the squadron retained its lead in the Commanding Officer MAG-11 Trophy races. Five volleyball team members were selected to compete in the Vietnamese olympics held at HUE.

PART III - Significant Events

1. Personnel. During June eighteen enlisted extended their Vietnam tour by six months. Three enlisted reenlisted during the month and one Sgt, two Cpls, five LCpls, and two Captains were promoted to their present rank. Four officers and three enlisted were joined and two officers and five enlisted were dropped. In addition to the others dropped Major J. M. MCGARVEY and Captain J. E. CARLTON JR. were transferred to the Missing & Captured Personnel Unit at HQMC.

2. Administration. N/A.

3. Awards. Aircrews were awarded 54 air medals during June (see Appendix B, Tabs 1 and 2). Capt E. M. WEBER was awarded a \$200 prize under the Marine Corps Incentive Award Program for his design for an offset plotting board for use in plotting bearing and distance from targets to offset aimpoints for use with DIANE computer and available maps and charts.

4. Casualties. One Sgt was medevaced to CONUS as a result of a tractor accident on 1 June.

5. Civic Action. The project initiated in February to screen in the dispensary in the village of HOA VANG was completed. During June a closer liaison between the MAG-11 Civil Affairs team and members of VNA(AW) 242's team was accomplished resulting in the completion of a joint project to construct an 8 by 10 foot irrigating well. Crayons, dental care kits, and scrap ordnance boxes were distributed to the villagers the latter being utilized for storage, firewood, and parts such as hinges and locks.

6. Morale/Welfare Programs. Nineteen squadron members participated in out of country R&R, ten took fishing trips, two took the Danang tour, three went to Chu Lai, and four to China Beach.

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Four officers and one SNCO were members of the MAG-11 volleyball team which won the 1stMAW volleyball tourney and was subsequently selected to compete in the Vietnamese Olympics at HUE in July. The squadron softball team was leading in the Wing softball tournament.

7. Informational Services. Twenty-five Fleet Home Town News releases were submitted and five feature articles were written with the Wing Informational Services Office.

11. Air Operations. VMA(AW) 242 flew 333 sorties, 293 of them at night and 189 in North Vietnam for a total of 479.2 flight hours. The squadron continued flying into all route packages in North Vietnam and continued TPQ work in South Vietnam and the area of the DMZ and north.

17. Training. The first of the replacement aircrews were trained on rules of engagement and squadron tactics and SOP. Officers and enlisted were given indoctrination lectures and fam-fired the M-16 Rifle. Aircrews were briefed on SAR posture, escape and evasion, survival gear, and were refreshed on rules of engagement during June. Enlisted training of both technical and general military subjects was performed during June. Two aircrews attended the JEST, jungle survival training at NAS, Cubi Point, and sea survival at Numazu City. Two nuclear weapons loading teams retrained at MCAS Iwakuni.

20. Motor Transport. Average availability was 93 percent for six vehicles assigned.

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21. Engineering. N/A.

22. Maintenance. The maintenance effort for the latter part of June was seriously impaired by the loss of the Intermediate Maintenance Activity (IMA) avionics capability for the AN/ASQ 61 Computer. The components were sent to MAG-12 for repair, but the test benches at Chu Lai were found to be incompatible with the squadron's components as they were designed for a newer computer program. The problem of inadequate ground air conditioners also contributed to the poorest readiness posture that VMA(AW) 242 has experienced since arrival in November 1966. Early rotation of enlisted maintenance personnel became a reality, as the orders for incoming personnel were received. Three aircraft, BuNo 152588, 152590, 152591 were placed on their first PAR date extension. The 1st MAW has requested new production aircraft vice the PAR aircraft originally scheduled for replacement of existing aircraft.

23. Avionics. Definite plans have been formulated for increased space to work on the A6A radar. A new 50 by 100 foot cement area will be laid to accommodate two more aircraft for maintenance. This plus the present space utilized will be reveted and covered with the hopes of installing permanent maintenance air conditioning in these areas.

24. Basic Development/Construction. Revetments for additional storage and aircraft stalls were completed in June.

25. Communications/Electronics. N/A26. Ordnance. Total ordnance dropped in June was 1409.79 tons.
