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Secretary of the Navy and Admiral U.S. Grant Sharp, CincPac, visited the Squadron area on 9 - 10 July 1967.

PART II - Narrative Summary

July 1967, the Squadron's ninth month on the line in Viet Nam, was marked by a continuation of the Rolling Thunder missions to Route Packages I, II, III, IV, V, VIA and VIB, Tally Ho missions in Route Package I; TPQ missions; Radar Survey missions; and the introduction of the circular error probable/instant bomb damage assessment; CEP/IBDA program. This latter program was designed to determine the feasibility of instantaneous BDA as a substitute for pre-strike and post-strike photo missions and to provide some A6A BDA. (See special operations and Appendix A.)

A Squadron aircraft, BuNo 152591, burned 7 July, following an explosion during hot refueling. A plane captain sustained second and third degree burns during the explosion while the two aircrew members exited the burning aircraft without serious injury. The Secretary of Defense, Under Secretary of the Navy, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the U.S. Military Commander Pacific, and Commander MACV toured the Squadron area on 9 and 10 July.

DaNang Air Base came under enemy rocket attack on 15 July. The Squadron hangar received one direct hit and five aircraft were damaged in their revetments by two other rockets. The Vietnamese Air Force ammunition dump exploded damaging virtually every structure in the VMA(AW)-242 cantonment. Five enlisted men were injured during the attack.

The Squadron athletic program cinched the MAG-11 Commanding Officer's trophy after finishing in a tie for the softball championship and winning the playoff. Five squadron members also participated in the Hue Olympic games.

PART III - Significant Events

1. Personnel. During July the following personnel were promoted to their present rank: one 1stLt, 1 MSgt, 4 SSgt's, 12 Sgt's, 6 Cpl's and 2 LCpl's. Five officers, two Marine enlisted, and one Navy enlisted were transferred from the Squadron in July and four officers and two enlisted were joined. Nineteen requests for six month Viet Nam tour extensions were approved bringing the total to forty two. Two enlisted Marines were returned to CONUS for special thirty day leave.

2. Administration. N/A

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3. Awards. During the month of July forty-nine Air Medals were earned by VMA(AW)-242 Aviators. (See Appendix B.)

Major J. A. MARTIN and CWO-2 D. E. WILSON were awarded a Navy Commendation Medal on 16 July 1967 from the Commanding General FMFPac for a Tally Ho flight through thunderstorms and enemy ground fire in North Viet Nam.

LtCol JACOBSON and Capt ANDERST were awarded a gold star in lieu of one mission twelfth Air Medal from the Commanding General FMFPac on 30 July 1967 for a hazardous Rolling Thunder mission in North Viet Nam.

LCpl BURDICK and LCpl SOUTHARD received meritorious masts from the Commanding Officer during July for a noteworthy performance of duties in the Squadron Ordnance shop.

4. Casualties. Three enlisted were medevaced during July as non-hostile casualties. Five enlisted were wounded in action during the rocket attack on DaNang 15 July 1967.

5. Civic Action. During the early part of the month Squadron personnel worked in conjunction with the MAG-11 Civil Affairs Team to haul cement, bricks and wood, in the district of Hoa Vang, and VMA(AW)-242 gave over sixty (60) sheets of tin to people who needed them in the village of Ap Mot. In the middle of the month, VMA(AW)-242 was assigned a part of a small village south of Ap Mot. The area assigned consists of over fifteen families. The civil affairs officer made numerous trips to the hamlet to talk to the hamlet chief, and ideas were exchanged on how to improve the welfare of his people. In August VMA(AW)-242 anticipates to begin building houses and reconstructing wells.

6. Morale/Welfare Programs. Twenty-two squadron members participated in out-of-country R&R, three in in-country R&R, four took fishing trips, and one went to a Chu Lai Tour in July.

The Squadron softball team finished in a tie with VMF(AW)-232 for the MAG-11 softball championship and then won two playoff games for the title and undisputed victory of the MAG-11 Commanding Officer's Trophy.

Four officers and one enlisted participated in the Hue Olympics, finishing as runners-up in volleyball and tennis.

7. Informational Services. Twenty eight fleet home town news releases were submitted during July along with two feature stories.

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8. Intelligence/Counter Intelligence. Weekly presentations of "Escape and Evasion" tips are being given to aircrews from information gathered at formal survival schools. Additional evasion charts of North Viet Nam have been ordered to enable each crew member to have permanent custody of the charts thus eliminating the need for a pool of survival packets.

S-2 officers of VMA(AW)-242, have been assigned to MAG-11 S-2 as briefing/debriefing officers on a TAD basis, thus widening their knowledge of the other MAG-11 Squadrons' functions.

Five minute weekly presentations are given to the enlisted members of the squadron to apprise them of III MAF activities as well as a summary of squadron operations.

9. EGM. N/A.

10. Photo. Requests have been submitted for Side Looking Radar photography of Special Forces Camps in I Corps. A 35mm half frame camera has been received from Grumman Aircraft Engineering Corp. for evaluation as a radar scope camera. Photos obtained from its use on Rolling Thunder Missions will be included in target briefing folders after a thorough debriefing with the aircrew flying the mission during which the photos were taken.

11. Air Operations. During the month of July VMA(AW)242 flew 365 sorties for 480.9 hours. Total combat sorties were 352 for 464.5 hours of which 324 sorties were flown at night for 418.0 hours. Ordnance expended was 1711.65 tons. Missions were flown into the entire I Corps area as well as into the Tally Ho and Rolling Thunder areas of North Vietnam (Route Packages I, II, III, IV, V, VIA, and VIB). (See Appendix C).

12. Air Defense/Control. N/A.

13. Special Operations. A new program was initiated to provide Instant Bomb Damage Assessment. This program, alluded to as the CEP/IBDA program, involved the utilization of a full system A6A (to find, identify, and attack the target), an RF4 in trail (to film the bomb detonations) and an F4 to position the RF4 at the proper interval behind the A6A. Twelve CEP/IBDA sorties were flown on practice and actual targets both day and night. Early results indicated that such a concept was possible, but employed as such, the elements of surprise and flexibility of run-in: heading speed, and altitude; and type of attack were seriously impaired. It was necessary for voice transmissions between the three aircraft; photo flares were required for photo illumination; and the A6A was confined to a prebriefed level delivery.

14. Ground Defense. All hands responded well during the rocket attack of 15 July.

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15. Command Relationship/Command and Control. No change in July.
16. NBC Warfare. N/A.
17. Training. Two aircrew members attended the JEST, jungle survival training at NAS Cubi Point. Aircrews received weekly briefing on SAR posture and escape and evasion tips, and survival gear. Five USAFI Courses were taken out and three tests were completed. One ECI course was taken out and one MCI test was completed. One officer was sent to Registered Publications School.
18. Logistics. (See Appendix D).
19. Supply. N/A.
20. Motor Transport. Average availability was 96 percent for six vehicles assigned. One vehicle was severely damaged during rocket attack.
21. Engineering. The squadron is awaiting an estimate of damage to hangar during attack and repair plans.
22. Maintenance. Squadron Maintenance installed one KD-2, 35mm half frame radar scope camera in one aircraft and five additional cameras are on order. During July only one air conditioner was available for aircraft systems maintenance. Three H&MS vans were packed up on the 15 of July for shipment back to CONUS. New vans did not arrive, thus there was no repair capability for inertial navigation systems, auto pilots, air data, computers, and inter-valometers after that time. The new squadron bomb dump was fully implemented into the SATS concept.
- Aircraft BuNo 151796 was received from CONUS to replace 152591 which was damaged by fire on 7 July 1967, and which has been transferred to H&MS-11 for shipment to NAS Norfolk, Va. for repair.
- Five aircraft were damaged along with the hangar and several vehicles during the rocket attack 15 July. The aircraft were subsequently repaired and returned to flight status; the hangar remains unrepaired.
- Aircraft systems availability for July was approximately one half that of the previous month due to limited air conditioning and parts availability.
23. Avionics. The repair capability for computer drums and forward pedestal was non-existent during July, reducing average availability to three computers.

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24. Base Development/Construction. Following the rocket attack of 15 July a resurgence of bunker building was apparent. Additional bunkers were built both at the flight line and in the living spaces. All bunkers are now covered.

The dust fence was completely destroyed and a work request has been submitted. Every structure in the living area was damaged during the rocket attack and will require repair.

An air conditioned trailer was installed in the enlisted billeting area to be used as a TV, reading, and writing room.

Following the 15 July 67 attack the squadron bomb dump was moved to a revetted area near the hangar, but away from the flight line.

SATS hangars for cleaning and storage of ordnance racks were assembled and installed and are proving valuable.

25. Communications/Electronics. N/A.

26. Ordnance. Total ordnance expended in July was 1711.65 tons. Ordnance release reliability was 98% in July.

b. Comments on excessive NORS/NORM percentages.

(1) During the month of July 76 NORS/O requisitions were initiated in addition to 13 unfilled NORS/O requisitions brought forward from the previous months. Of the 76 NORS/O requisitions for July, 60 were filled by Group Supply. The average time required to complete each requisition was 3.7 hours. The remaining 16 requisitions were passed off station, of which 15 were filled with an average of 176.2 hours supply reaction time which is also excessive. The 13 unfilled NORS/O requisitions brought forward from the previous months were filled during the month of July.

(2) During the month of July 140 NORS/N requisitions were initiated and 36 unfilled NORS/N requisitions were brought forward from previous months. Of the 176 NORS/N requisitions 125 were completed during the month of July. The average time required to complete each NORS/N requisition was 52.5 hours. This also represented an excess of supply reaction time.

(3) The excessive NORM is primarily attributed to lack of air conditioners to facilitate and expedite maintenance on certain avionics weapons systems. On hand, for the vast majority of maintenance trouble shooting, is the NR-2A air conditioner, which operates for periods of 10-20 minutes then has to be shut down prior to over heating. After letting it cool, maintenance/trouble shooting resumes.
