NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. For the fifth consecutive month, HAH-262 exceeded the CNO Flight Hour Utilization Factor by accumulating 1,785.1 flight hours. This commendable flight record was achieved with an average of 17 operationally ready CH-46D aircraft. The squadron flew 7,530 sorties and 4,029 tasks supporting the 1st Marine Division, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, Republic of Korea Marine Corps, and III Marine Amphibious Force, transporting 557.2 tons of cargo and 16,516 passengers. Cratterbox aircraft were responsible for 165 medevac missions accounting for a total of 525 US, ROK, and ARVN troops. Priorities were: (1) 175 emergencies; (2) 141 priorities, and; (3) 305 routines.

2. Combat flight hours for August were flown in Quang Nam and Quang Tin Provinces within the Tactical Areas of Responsibility of the 1st Marine Division and the Republic of Korea Marine Corps.

2. Awards. The Strike/Flight Air Medal was awarded to 13 squadron members during August 1970. 7 Aircrew Wings, 1 Purple Heart, and 5 single mission Air Medals were awarded.

3. Informational Services. HMM-262 published 60 home town news releases for Aircrew Wings, Air Medals, Promotions, and Tactical Flight Hours.

4. Operational Highlights

By flying nearly 1800 hours this month, HMM-262 reached a flight hour peak unparalleled since this squadron moved south from Quang Tri.
