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## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Due to poor weather HMM-262 was unable to meet the ONO Flight Hour Utilization Factor. However, with a daily average of 13 CH-46B helicopters available, the squadron flew 1008.2 hours, carried 8,272 passenger and moved 246.2 tons of cargo in support of the 1st Marine Division, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, Republic of Korea Marine Corps and the III Marine Amphibious Force. During the month of October Chatterbox med-evac aircraft flew 162 missions and evacuated 386 sick and injured persons; 112 of these were emergencies, 147 priorities and 127 routines.
2. HMM-262 conducted operations in the provinces of Quang Nam and Quang Tin and within the TAOR's of the 1st Marine Division and the Republic of Korea Marine Corps.
3. HMM-262 was involved in 16 fire incidents. Eight aircraft received hits and two aircraft crewmen were wounded but there were no fatalities.

6 October 1970

Four Chatterbox aircraft participated in a troop insert in the Alligator Lake region of the Que Son Mountains.

9 October 1970

Chatterbox aircraft participated in two strikes today. One strike was North East of An Hoa. Two aircraft received hits and made precautionary landings at An Hoa. Two crew-members received minor injuries. Both aircraft were later recovered.

22 October 1970

Chatterbox aircraft participated in a quick reaction strike in the foothills of the Que Son Mountains today. Several enemy were killed and captured while gathering rice. Several weapons and packs were also recovered.

26 October 1970

Once again Chatterbox aircraft participated in a quick reaction strike against the enemy gathering rice. Facing a low ceiling and impending darkness Chatterbox aircraft recovered the troops they had earlier inserted suffering several hits in the aircraft but no injuries or significant damage resulted.

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30 October 1970

Once again Chatterbox aircraft responded to a call for help. Braving low ceilings, high winds and extremely low visibility, Chatterbox aircraft rescued more persons from flood waters than any other OH-46D squadron. Several aircraft even entered the Viet Cong infested Arizona Territory in attempts to save women and children.

Many individual acts of heroism were performed by crew-members who risked their lives in the surging waters to save Vietnamese children and elderly persons.

31 October 1970

Chatterbox aircraft returned to help victims of the flood. Evacuations were carried out most of the day. Expert airmanship on the part of the pilots and crews enabled even difficult hoist rescues to go smoothly and all aircraft returned undamaged.
