NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT HIGHLIGHTS OCCURRING DURING
THE REPORTING PERIOD

SUMMARY

(U) For the month of October 1966, HMM-263 flew 1527 hours. The majority of this time consisted of troop lift, resupply, and administrative missions for III MAF. In addition, the squadron also provided the Med-Evac aircraft for the Danang TAOR. Throughout the month detachments of HMM-263 aircraft assisted in the support of the Phu Bai TAOR and Operation Prairie. All important incidents and events will be included in the following daily narrative.

- 1 October 1966 - (U) LtCol M. T. JANNELL relieved LtCol J. L. GEOBEL as Commanding Officer of HMM-263. All flight operations were routine support missions for III MAF. One aircraft on a Med-Evac mission received 4 hits from automatic weapons fire at coord BT 015538. No one was hurt. Aircraft on a VIP hop received small arms fire from coord AT 897505 and 884526, and 12.7mm fire from coord AT 890520. None of the aircraft were hit.
- 2 October 1966 - (U) Normal operations were conducted today. Med-Evac aircraft received fire from coord AT 977596, 993635, and BT 176557. The aircraft at AT 977596 was hit by small arms fire. The aircraft at coord AT 993635 received small arms and automatic weapons fire and was hit by two pieces of shrapnel from a mortar that exploded in the landing zone. No one was hurt.
- 3 October 1966 - (U) Five squadron aircraft flew in support of Operation Prairie today. The remainder of the flying was routine missions in the TAOR. One Med-Evac aircraft took fire from coord AT 978-604 but was not hit.
- 4 October 1966 - (U) Five squadron aircraft continued support of Operation Prairie. In the local area aircraft on recon hops received fire from coord YD 680-157, AT 985690 and 985691. None of the aircraft were hit. All other operations were normal.
- 5 October 1966 - (U) Two aircraft on a resupply mission received small arms fire from coord AT 879470 and 8852

but were not hit. All other operations were normal.

- 6 October 1966 - (U) HMM-263 flew a total of 49.8 hours today. Aircraft took fire from coord AT 879470, 8852, 977594, 984592, 970592, YD 737081, BT 182502, 016628, and 000610. Only one aircraft was hit. The aircraft at coord AT 977594, while on a Med-Evac mission was hit by two small arms rounds. Damage was minor and there were no injuries.
- 7 October 1966 - (U) Normal operations were conducted today. Med-Evac aircraft received fire from coord AT 981600, 967586, 860590, and YD 103694. Two aircraft on a resupply mission to coord BT 103694 also received fire. No aircraft were hit.
- 8 October 1966 - (U) All operations were routine today, only two aircraft received fire. One aircraft on a Med-Evac mission received fire from coord YD 625745 and one aircraft at coord AT 820465 on a resupply mission took fire. Neither aircraft was hit.
- 9 October 1966 - (U) Med-Evac aircraft received fire from coord AT 990621. There were no hits. All other missions were routine.
- 10 October 1966 - (U) HMM-263 flew 50.3 hours and lifted 28 Med-Evac's today. There were no reported fire incidents and all operations were normal.
- 11 October 1966 - (U) The squadron flew normal missions in support of III MAF today. Aircraft received fire from coord YD 095502, AT 954367, and BT 068675. The aircraft at coord AT 954367 received two hits, but damage was minor and there were no injuries.
- 12 October 1966 - (U) Normal operations were conducted today. One Med-Evac aircraft took fire from coord BT 183573 but was not hit.
- 13 October 1966 - (U) All missions flown today were routine. Aircraft on a recon retraction received fire from coord AT 870650 but were not hit.
- 14 October 1966 - (U) Routine missions for III MAF were flown today. One aircraft was fired at from coord AT 979572 but was not hit.
- 15 October 1966 - (U) The squadron flew 57.1 hours today. Two Med-Evac aircraft were hit with small arms

rounds in the vicinity of coord BT 075675. Damage was minor and there were no injuries. Other Med-Evac aircraft were fired at from coord ZC 144534 and AT 966689 but were not hit. LtCol L. L. DARBYSHIRE relieved LtCol M. T. JANNELL as Commanding Officer of HMM-263.

- 16 October 1966 - (U) All operations were normal today. Squadron aircraft received fire from coord AT 975-688 and 965594 but were not hit. 56.7 hours were flown.
- 17 October 1966 - (U) The squadron flew 40.5 hours today. 164 passengers, 17 tons of cargo, and 68 Med-Evacs were lifted. Med-Evac aircraft received fire from coord BT 016565, AT 855415, and 8949 and BT 142619. There were no hits. The aircraft at coord AT 8949 was fired at by 12.7mm.
- 18 October 1966 - (U) Total time for today was 59.9 hours. Aircraft received fire from coord BT 070080, 157-591, 205400, AT 965592, and 9352. Only one aircraft was hit at coord BT 070080. There were no injuries and damage was minor.
- 19 October 1966 - (U) HMM-263 flew 63.3 hours today. No aircraft were hit although aircraft on Med-Evac missions received fire from coord AT 880495, 970600, BT 090645 and 068557.
- 20 October 1966 - (U) 38.1 hours were flown today. One aircraft on a recon insert took five hits from small arms at coord YD 555231. There were no injuries. Other squadron aircraft took fire from coord AT 988652 and BT 086533 but were not hit.
- 21 October 1966 - (U) Normal operations were conducted today. One Med-Evac aircraft received fire from coord YD 567233 and aircraft on a recon insert received fire from coord AT 903700 but were not hit.
- 22 October 1966 - (U) HMM-263 had two aircraft hit today. Both were hit by sniper fire and in both incidents damage was minor. One aircraft was on a Med-Evac mission and the other was on an admin run. All other missions were routine.
- 23 October 1966 - (U) Operations were limited today due to inclement weather. Several missions were flown however and one aircraft was hit at coord AT 999545 by automatic weapons fire.

No one was injured.

- 24 October 1966 - (U) Routine resupply, admin, and Med-Evac missions were flown today. Squadron aircraft received enemy fire from coord AT 9995, BT 005389, 026620, and 033555. None of the aircraft were hit.
- 25 October 1966 - (U) All operations were normal today. One aircraft on an admin hop was hit at coord AT 870468. Another aircraft, also on an admin hop was fired at from coord AT 995657 but was not hit.
- 26 October 1966 - (U) Five squadron aircraft were fired at from coord AT 985585. One aircraft was hit injuring a Vietnamese civilian in the aircraft. One other squadron aircraft was hit while on an admin hop at coord YD 509-344. No one was injured. The remainder of the day's flying was routine.
- 27 October 1966 - (U) Routine support of III MAF was flown today. One aircraft was hit by small arms and automatic weapons fire at coord AT 991-581. One med-Evac aboard the aircraft was reinjured. The aircraft received a total of five hits but returned safely. Other squadron aircraft received fire from coord AT 933644, 990580, and 812340 but were not hit.
- 28 October 1966 - (U) The squadron sent eight aircraft to Dong Ha today to support Operation Prairie. In the local TAOR one aircraft was hit by small arms fire at coord BT 110550. There were no injuries and damage was minor.
- 29 October 1966 - (U) The majority of the flying today was in support of Operation Prairie. Routine courier and med-Evac missions were flown in the TAOR. One med-Evac aircraft received fire from coord BT 035675 but was not hit.
- 30 October 1966 - (U) HMH-263 flew 30.7 hours in support of Operation Prairie today. On a Med-Evac mission in the TAOR aircraft received fire from coord BT 090690 and AT 960595. There were no hits.
- 31 October 1966 - (U) The squadron continued support of Operation Prairie today. A total of 29.2 hours were flown in support of Operation Prairie. One med-Evac aircraft in the TAOR received fire from coord AT 972668 but was not hit.

1. (U) During the month of October the squadron activity consisted of supporting the following:

- a. Operation Prairie
- b. Routine TAOR missions, Phu Bai
- c. Routine TAOR missions, Danang

2. (C) In support of Operation Prairie, HMM-263 gave considerable aircraft availability. The squadron gave total UH34D support for Operation Prairie for the last five days of October. This area was especially quiet and no fire incidents were reported during this time.

3. (C) During October the squadron gave support to HMM-161 by performing missions in the Phu Bai TAOR. There were several fire incidents reported in this area, however it proved less hostile than the Danang TAOR area. The majority of time was spent on resupply and recon insertions and re-tractions.

4. (C) As usual the largest area for fire incidents was the Danang TAOR. Again the Med-Evac missions accounted for over half the total fire incidents for the month. Comparing the Danang TAOR with the Phu Bai and Dong Ha TAOR, the Danang TAOR has a larger number of Med-Evac's, with a larger percentage of Med-Evac missions drawing fire than both Phu Bai and Dong Ha.

1. During the month of October 1966 the maintenance department began to take on a new face. The new inexperienced personnel joined during the previous month seasoned quickly and aircraft availability went up. The build-up of personnel continued throughout the month.
2. The Monsoons began during the month and curbed the flying effort on at least six days. Since all maintenance is performed outdoors the rain presents a handicap for personnel working on aircraft.
3. Deployment of aircraft and maintenance personnel increased this month with heavy commitments at Dong Ha, Phu Bai, Khe Sanh and on two occasions RONS at outposts due to weather conditions. It was necessary to dispatch maintenance recovery crews only once.
4. Component changes took a sharp drop as opposed to the previous two months and battle damaged aircraft turn around time decreased. The squadron has twenty two aircraft in physical custody with another aircraft scheduled to leave for overhaul in five days. Total flight hours for the month was 1527 hours. Operational ready hours for aircraft was 91%. Average aircraft down for battle damage was 2 per day.
5. The squadron received its first R&Rs which gave a boost to the morale of all hands.
