



NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. Daily Summary of Events. The following was flown in support of III MAF, 1st MARDIV, Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS, DARING REBEL, PIPESTONE CANNON, ROKMC and Operation VICTORY DRAGON.
- 1 May 1969 (C) HNM-263 flew 117 sorties for 38.5 flight hours, lifting 19.0 tons of cargo and carrying 259 troops/passengers. Twenty-seven medevac missions were flown evacuating 3 emergency, 13 priority and 11 routine casualties. Two fire incidents were reported with negative hits or injury, and 300 rounds of .50 cal being expended.
- 2 May 1969 (C) HHI-263 flow 181 sorties for 57.2 flight hours, lifting 23.2 tons of cargo and carrying 347 troops/passengers. Fourteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 9 emergency, 6 priority and 3 routine casualties. Three fire incidents were reported with negative hits or injury and 300 rounds of .50 cal being expended.
- 3. May 1969 (C) HMi-263 flew 165 sorties for 40.0 flight hours, lifting 24.2 tons of cargo and carrying 523 troops/passengers. Six medevac missions were flown evacuating 1 emergency, 1 priority and 4 routing.
- 4 May 1969 (C) HAI-263 flew 163 sorties for 45.6 flight hours, lifting 24.9 tons of cargo and carrying 224 troops/passengers. Twenty-seven medevac missions were flown evacuating 7 emergency, 21 priority and 13 routine casualties.
- 5 May 1969 (C) HTM-263 flew 187 sorties for 48.6 flight hours, lifting 27.6 tons of cargo and carrying 657 troops/passengers. Two medevac missions were flown evacuating 4 priority and 1 routine casualties.
- 6 May 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 10h sorties for 39.8 flight hours, lifting 5.9 tons of cargo and carrying 239 troops/passengers. Two fire incidents were reported with negative hits or injury and 125 rounds of .50 cal being expended.

7 May 1969 (C) HMM-263 flow 162 sorties for 37.8 flight hours, lifting 25.5 tons of cargo and carrying 148 troops/passengers. Sixteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 3 emergency, 5 priority and 9 routine casualties.

8 May 1969 (C) Hold-263 flew 138 sorties for 33.2 flight hours,
lifting 14.4 tons of cargo and carrying 243 troops/
passengers. Ten medevac missions were flown evacuating 6 cmergency, 5 priority and 1 routine casualties.

9 May 1969 (C) HTM-263 flew 118 sorties for 40.3 flight hours, lifting 4.0 tons of cargo and carrying 235 troops/passengers. Four medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 emergency and 3 priority casualties.

10 May 1969 (C) HTM-263 flew 102 sorties for 34.7 flight hours, lifting 10.0 tons of cargo and carrying 67 troops/passengers. Thirty-three medevac missions were flown evacuating 9 emergency, 28 priority and 9 routine casualties.

11 May 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 137 sorties for 35.0 flight hours, lifting 18.9 tons of cargo and carrying 131 troops/passengers. Six medevac missions were flown evacuating 9 emergency casualties.

12 May 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 103 sorties for 29.0 flight hours, lifting 8.6 tons of cargo and carrying 173 troops/ passengers. Five medevac missions were flown evacuating 7 emergency and 5 routine casualties.

13 May 1969 (C) HFM-263 flew 46 sorties for 13.6 flight hours, lifting 54 troops/passengers. Twenty-one medevac mission were flown evacuating 27 emergency, 16 priority and 4 routine casualties.

14 May 1969 (C) H-M-263 flew 131 sorties for 49.1 flight hours,
lifting 4.0 tons of cargo and carrying 284 troops/
passengers. Eleven medevac missions were flown
cvacuating 6 emergency, and 5 priority casualties.
Two fire incidents were reported with negative hits
or injury and 200 rounds of .50 cal being expended.

15 May 1969 (C) Hil-263 flew 115 sorties for 35.3 flight hours, lifting 14.0 tons of cargo and carrying 324 troops/passengers.

- 17 May 1969 (C) HNM-263 flow 187 sorties for 44.9 flight hours, lifting 39.3 tons of cargo and carrying 296 troops/passengers. Six modevac missions were flown evacuating 4 emergency and 2 priority casualties. One fire incident was reported with no hits or injury and 200 rounds of .50 cal being expended.

- 20 May 1969 (C) MM-263 flew 223 sorties for 62.1 flight hours, lifting 59.3 tons of cargo and carrying 322 troops/passengers. Thirteen medevac missions were flown evacuating 14 emergency and 5 priority casualties. One fire incident was received with one hit.
- 21 May 1969 (C) HMI-263 flew 146 scrtics for 39.7 flight hours, lifting 23.6 tons of cargo and carrying 314 troops/ passengers. One medevac mission was flown evacuating 1 emergency casualty.
- 22 May 1969 (C) HII-263 flew 84 sorties for 22.8 flight hours, lifting 8.3 tons of cargo, and carrying 13 troops/ passengers. Twenty-five medevac missions were flown evacuating 9 emergency, 15 priority and 1 routine casualties.



28 May 1969 (C) HNI-263 flew 128 sorties for 30.3 flight hours, lifting 18.1 tons of cargo and carrying 178 troops/passengers. Thirty medevac missions were flown evacuating 13 emergency, 19 priority and 113 routine casualties.










- 1. Daily Summary of Events. The following was flown in support of III MAF, 1st MANDIV, ROKMC, OPERATION PIFESTONE CANYON, and OPERATION VICTORY DRAGON.
- 1 June 1969 (C) HTM-263 flew 13h sorties for 28.9 flight hours, lifting 29.3 tons of cargo and carrying 123 troops/passengers. Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 3 priority, and 2 routine casualties. One fire incident was reported with one hit, no injuries, and 50 rounds of 50 cal. being expended.
- 2 June 1969 (C) HMM-236 flew 208 sorties for 48.3 flight hours lifting 52.3 tons of cargo and carrying 264 troops/ passengers. Five medevac missions were flown evacuating 4 emergency, 1 priority and 4 routine casualties.
- 3 June 1969 (C) HRI-263 flew 136 sorties for 23.5 flight hours lifting 43.6 tons of cargo and carrying 27 troops/passengers. Two medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 emergency, 3 priority, 7 routine casualties.
- 4 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 205 sorties for 46.4 flight hours, lifting 35.8 tons of cargo and carrying 305 troops/passengers. Twonty-four medevac missions were flown evacuating 16 emergency, 20 priority, and 29 routine casualties. Two fire incidents were reported with one hit and no injuries, and no ammunition expended.
- 5 June 1969 (C) HMC-263 flew 159 sorties for 52.1 Hight hours, lifting 49.8 tons of cargo and carrying 311 troops/ passengers. Two medevac missions were flown evacuating 6 routine casualties.
- 6 June 1969 (C) HM=263 flew 117 sorties for 27.4 hours and barrying 54 troops/passengers. Twenty-three medevac missions were flown evacuating 10 emergency, 8 priority and 7 routine casualties.
- 7 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 222 sorties for 57.2 flight hours, lifting 33.0 tons of cargo and carrying 164 troops/ passengers. Forty-two medevac missions were flown evacuating 52 emergency, 34 priority and 20 routine casualties.
- 8 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 123 sorties for 38.1 flight hours, lifting 31.6 tons of cargo and carrying 166 troops/passengers. One medevac mission will light Scattering 1 emergency casualty.




- 9 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 233 sorties for 55.6 flight hours, lifting 44.8 tons of cargo, and carrying 246 troops/passengers. Twenty-six medevac missions were flown evacuating 13 emergency, 16 priority, and 16 routine casualties. One fire incident was received with 10 hits and 1 WMA.
- 10 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 406 sorties for 78.0 flight hours, lifting 60.0 tons of cargo, and carrying 918 troops/passengers. Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 emergency and 3 priority casualties.
- Li June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 141 sorties for 54.1 flight hours, lifting 14.3 tons of cargo and carrying 241 troops/passengers. Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 1 emergency and 2 routine casualties.
- 12 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 95 sorties for 36.3 flight hours, lifting 11.2 tons of cargo, and carrying 28 troops/ passengers. Eleven medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 emergency, 10 priority, and 4 routine casualties.
- 13 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 170 sorties for 40.9 flight hours, lifting 16,8 tons of cargo, and carrying 136 troops/passengers. Twenty-five medevac missions were flown evacuating 7 emergency, 11 priority, and 24 routine casualties.
- 14 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 157 sorties for 37.6 flight hours, lifting 47.3 tons of cargo, and carrying 315 troops/ passengers.
- 15 June 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 139 sorties for 48.7 flight hours, lifting 8.8 tons of cargo, and carrying 321 troops/ passengers. Nino medevac missions were flown evacuating 6 emergency, 7priority, and 12 routine casualties.


4. INTELLIGENCE

- a. The Squadron continued to receive, record, and interpret Intelligence information from III MAF, 1st MAN, 1st MARDIV, MAG-16, 1st RECOM and the 7th Marines. Through spot reports, fire incident reports, and other pilot debriefing forms, intelligence information was passed to MAG-16 for dissemination to higher, lower and adjacent units.
 - HMM-263 received no incoming rounds during this reporting period.
- c. To provide continuing up-date of intelligence, the Intelligence Section conducted briefs at the weekly AOI. Crew Chiefs and Gunners have been invited to visit the Intelligneed Section at any time to keep them abreast of the energy situation and to discuss spot reports. The Rich of the Day was used to pass items of information to Squadron personnel.
- d. Four Officers and two Enlisted attended Jungle Escape and Survival Training at MAS Cubi Point, R.P.

- (1) Thirty aircraft of Holl-263 flew 526 sorties for 155.2 flight hours, lifting 1,051 troops/passengers and 134.2 tons of cargo. Five medevac missions were flown evacuating 2 emergency, 2 priority and 2 routime, all in support of Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS.
