NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. Daily Summary of Events, The following was flown in support of III MAF, 1st MARDIV, ROKMC, OPERATION PIPESTONE CANYON, OPERATION DURHAM PEAK, and OPERATION VICTORY DRAGON.
- 1 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 117 sorties for 29.9 flight hours, lifting 2.7 tons of cargo and carrying 290 troops/passengers. One medevac mission was flown cracuating 1 priority casualty. No fire incidents were reported.
- 2 July 1969 (C) HNM-263 flew 215 sorties for 37.8 flight hours, lifting 47.1 tons of cargo and 226 troops/passengers.
- 3 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 66 sorties for 19.8 flight hours, lifting no cargo and 7 troops/passengers. Seventeen medevac missions were flown evacuating 10 emergency, 16 priority, and 5 routine casualties.
- 4 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 241 sorties for 59.1 flight hours, lifting 17.8 tons of cargo and 445 troops/passengers. Seven medevac missions were evacuating 5 emergency, and 14 priority casualties.
- 5 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 164 sorties for 33.2 flight hours, lifting 51.4 tons of cargo and 136 trops/passengers. One fire incident was reported with negative hits of injuries, and 1000 rounds of .50 cal boing expended.
- 6 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 123 scrties for 26.9 flight hours, lifting 23.0 tons of cargo and 208 troops/passengers. Nine medevac middions were flown evacuating 3 emergency, 16 priority, and 5 routine casualties.
- 7 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 160 sorties for 44.9 flight hours, lifting 4.6 tons of cargo and 240 troops/passengers. Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 1 emergency, 1 priority, and 1 routine casualties. One fire incident was reported with negative hits or injury, and 200 rounds of .50 cal being expended.






- 8 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 266 sorties for 54.6 flight hours, lifting 69.1 tons of cargo and 426 troops/passengers. Four medevac missions were flown evacuating 1 priority and 11 routine casualties.


 One fire incident was reported with negative hits of injuries, and 200 rounds or .50 cal being expended.
- 9 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 92 sorties for 27.7 flight hours, lifting 0.8 tons of cargo and 102 troops/passengers. Ten medevac missions were flown evacuating 9 emergency, 7 priority, and 8 routine casualties.
- 10 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 179 sorties for 43.8 flight hours, lifting 35.9 tons of cargo and 343 troops/passengers. Two modevac missions were flown evacuating 3 emergency, and two priority casualties.
- 11 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 84 sorties for 24.3 flight hours, lifting 14.2 tens of cargo and 48 troops/pase engers. One medevac mission was flown evacuating 3 priority casualties.
- 12 July 1969 (C) HM-263 flew 130 sorties for 27.1 flight hours, lifting 23.8 tons of cargo and 103 troops/passengers. Seventeen medevac missions were flown evacuating 15 emergency, 6 priority, and 9 routine casualties.
- 13 July 1969 (C) HMM-263 flew 74 sorties for 22.3 flight hours, lifting 1.1 tons of cargo and 231 troops/passengers. One medevac mission was flown evace uating 1 priority casualty.





- 28 July 1969 (C) HEM-263 flew 115 sorties for 32.1 flight hours, lifting 29.0 tons of cargo and 99 troops/passengers. Eleven medevac missions were flown evacuating 18 emergency, 5 priority, and 1 routine casualties.

4. INTELLIGENCE

- a. The squadron continued to receive, record, and interpret intelligence information from III MAF, IstMAW, IstMARDIV, MAG-16 and 1st RECON. Through spot apports, fire incident reports and other pilot debriefing forms, intelligence information was passed to MAG-16 for dissemination to higher, lower and adjacent units.
- b. HMM-263 received no incoming rounds during this reporting period.
- c. 'HMM-263 was involved in several strikes during the reporting period. Separate briefs were given to pilots and enlisted acommonbers on these strikes.
- d. To provide continuing up-date of intelligence, the intelligence section conducted briefs at ACM's, the plan of the day was used to pass information to squadron personnel.

6. OPERATIONAL STATISTICS

a. Sixty One aircraft of HMM-263 flew 680 sorties for 230.1 flight hours, lifting 2,631 troops/passengers and 296.4 tons of cargo. Eight medevac missions were flown evacuating 12 emergency, 3 priority, and 4 routine casualties, all in support of Operation Pipestone Canyon.

b. Ten aircraft of HMN-263 flew 308 sorties for 50.3 flight hours, lifting 334 troops/passengers and 100.1 tons of cargo. Two medevas rassings were flown evacuating 3 emergency, and 3 priority casualties, all in support of Operation Victroy Dragon XIII.

c. Thirty One aircraft of HMM-263 flew 553 sorties for 131.6 flight hours, ligting 832 troops/passengers and 70.1 tons of cargo. Thirty Three medevac missions were flown evacuating 14 emergency, 10 priority, and 35 routine casualties, all in support of Operation Durham Peak.
