

2 March 1969: HMM-265 launched a total of nine aircraft in support of the First Marine Division, Third Marine Division and III MAF for a total of 21.9 hours. 56 combat troops, 3.1 tons of combat cargo and 39 Medevacs were transported in 62 sorties in completion of 12 tasks.


