

PART II MARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. VMA-311 has flown 23,140 combat sorties and over 28,348 hours in Republic of Viet Nam.
- 2. During July 1968 VMA-311 flew a total of 1319.0 flight hours of which 1294.5 were combat hours. A total of 1188 sorties of which 1158 were combat flown during this reporting period.
- 3. Average aircraft availability was 88.4% with an average on board of 19 aircraft and 19 pilots.
- 4. Total tonnage dropped this reporting period was 1680.2.


