


NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Marine Attack Squadron 311 has flown 31,439 combat sorties and 37,704 combat hours in the Republic of South Vietnam.
2. During the month of April 1969, VMA-311 flew a total of 919.5 flight hours of which 911.7 were combat hours. A total of 785 sorties were flown of which 773 were combat sorties.
3. The average number of aircraft on board was 16 with an average of 24 pilots available for the month of April. The average daily availability was 82.0% and the average daily operational ready aircraft in accordance with MCO P3000.2B was 34.6%.
4. The total tonnage dropped in April was 1106.101.

(1) During April 1969, VMA-311 flew 785 sorties for a total of 919.5 flight hours
