

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Marine Attack Squadron 311 has flown 33,416 combat sorties and 39,944 combat hours in the Republic of South Vietnam.
2. During the month of June 1969, VMA-311 flew a total of 1,189.3 flight hours of which 1,163.5 were combat hours. A total of 1,042 sorties were flown of which 1,015 were combat sorties.
3. The average number of aircraft on board was 19 with an average of 25 pilots available for the month of June. The average daily availability was 84% and the average daily operational ready aircraft in accordance with MCO P3000.2B was 42.3%.
4. The total tonnage dropped in June was 1,421.370.
5. On 30 June, LtCol. D. A. KELLY flew the 10,000th accident free sortie for Fiscal Year 1969.
6. During this 12 month period, the squadron participated in 48 separate operations while supporting III MAF and 7th Air Force. In so doing, the squadron dropped 16,693 tons of ordnance, flew 11,663 sorties, and amassed 13,094 flight hours. To accomplish these respectable totals the squadron averaged 1,091 hours in 977 sorties per month for the entire year. These hours were flown on a 7-days-per-week basis, under weather ranging from searing heat to monsoon rains and from a semi-expeditionary airfield. Also noteworthy, is the fact that there was a 100% turn over in enlisted personnel and a 200% turn over in officer ranks for the past Fiscal Year.
7. VMA-311 was chosen to represent MAG-12 for the Commandant of the Marine Corps Aviation Efficiency Award.
