PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. (U) Bad weather was prevalent at the start of the month and 30 sorties were lost through the first 4 days.
- 2. (U) Rocket attacks were also prevalent through out the month. Although there were numerous attacks they were of short duration and no damage was sustained by VMA-311.
- 3. (C) The squadron started giving close air support on a limited basis to Military Region II on 22 December. The radius of action was approximately 250 miles and no significant problems have been encountered thus far.
- 4. (U) On 23 December an all hands Christmas party was held at the Vietnamese Club at Rien Hoa. The Vietnamese Air Force did everything in their power to help the squadron have a successful party. Col BE the Commander Vietnamese Logistic Command was instrumental in the cutting of red tape. The event was successful in every aspect.
- 5. (U) The squadron was fortunate enough to have 70 reservation's: for the Bob HOPE Show at Ton San Nhut Air Base. 52 enlisted and 3 officers attended. The New Year was ushered in quietly with a cease fire commencing 1800 31 December.


