PART TWO

From 1 June to 30 June 1967, VMFA-314 conducted air operations out of MCAS Chu Lai, Vietnam.

PART THREE1. Personnel/Administration

During this reporting period VMFA-314 joined 2 officers and transferred 3. A total of 16 enlisted were joined and 19 were transferred.

16 enlisted were promoted in June, the breakdown is as follows: 3 to Sergeant and 6 to Corporal, 6 to Lance Corporal and 1 to Private First Class.

2. Awards

Aircrew members of VMFA-314 were awarded 104 Air Medals.

3. Casualties

No combat casualties occurred this month.

4. Air Operations

The squadron flew 676 sorties and 814.8 flight hours during the month of June.

Squadron efforts during this month were devoted to accomplishing assigned combat missions and toward the indoctrination of newly assigned aircrews.

Three aircraft received light damage as a result of enemy fire during bombing missions.

5. Schools

No aircrew members attended either of the jungle survival schools this month.

6. Aircraft Maintenance

During the month of June, 18 aircraft were assigned to this command, with 2 in PAR at Atsugi Japan and one chargeable being transferred to CONUS.

Total ordnance expended during June was 1,538.0 tons.
