PART III

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- A. Personnel Administration. During this reporting period VMFA-314 joined eight officers and transferred two. A total of eighteen enlisted personnel were joined and twenty-four transferred. Seven officers and fifty enlisted personnel were promoted in October. The breakdown is as follows; one LtCol, one Major, three Captains, two First Lieutenants, one GySgt, one SSgt, forty-four Corporals, four Lance Corporals.
- B. Intelligence/Training. The S-2 Officer conducted briefings for Officers as current intelligence information became available. The Physical Readiness Test was completed by all hands and a Personnel and Equipment Inspection of every individual was conducted.
- C. Awards. Aircrew members of VMFA-314 received eighty-nine air medals and two Distinguished Flying Crosses.
- D. Casualties. No combat casualties occurred this month.
- E. Air Operations. The Squadron flew 166 sorties for 235.8 flight hours during the month of October.
- F. Schools. No Squadron personnel attended schools this month. No aircrew members attended either of the Jungle Survival Schools.
- G. Aircraft Maintenance. During the month of October twenty-two aircraft were assigned to this squadron. Six were in PAR at NAS Atsugi, Japan.
- H. Ordnance. Total ordnance expended during October was 12.5 tons.
- I. Administrative and Materiel Inspection. The Squadron received an Administrative and Materiel inspection by FMFPac from 27 to 30 October 1967.
