PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

For the month of November VMFA-314 flew 522.1 combat hours and 448 combat sorties with aircrews averaging 24 sorties. The bomb damage assessment included 75 structures destroyed, 14 structures damaged, 29 bunkers destroyed, 3 bunkers damaged, 2 secondary explosions, 5 secondary fires, 21 fighting holes destroyed, 13 road cuts and 425 meters of trench line destroyed.

From 5-11 November 38 sorties were flown from the Air-to-Ground Hot Pad, for 41.4 hours.

On 10 November LtCol. PETERSEN led a section of F4 aircraft on the initial BARCAP in support of 7th Fleet operations. These operations are continuing on an extended basis.

On 18, 20 and 22 November VMFA-314 flew 12 sorties of night flak suppression A6 escort missions in support of VMA(AW)-533.

On 26 November VMFA-314 again assumed the Air-to-Ground Hot Pad flying 44 sorties for 49.5 hours.

VW-03 recovered Chu Lai Air Base on 1 November with landing gear malfunction which resulted in a landing on one main gear and nose gear. This was successfully accomplished by Major Carl E. R. BLACK and 1stLt. R. G. SCHMITT with minimal damage to the aircraft (ECHO Damage). "Attaboy" concerning this incident was submitted to CG, 1stMAW on 20 November.

On 28 November Major R. I. HARRIS and 1stLt. K. J. HERR flew the 7000th combat mission for this squadron on present tour.
