NARRATIVE SUMMARY

VMFA-314 flew 576.2 hours and 508 combat sorties during the month of February. Weather conditions significant to flight operations were encountered in the early part of the month and decreased visibility due to haze prevailed over the entire I Corps area for the month. 15 sorties and 14.4 hours were flown for ferry and maintenance flights. Pilot's averaged 28 missions and RIO's averaged 42 missions.

Among operations supported were Dewey Canyon, Taylor Common, Scotland II, and Nevada Eagle. Close air support was flown for the U. S. Army, U. S. Air Force, Republic of Korea and ARVN forces. BARCAPS were flown on 10, 11 and 12 February in support of U. S. Navy 7th Fleet operations.

The Air-Ground Hot Pad from 1 February to 3 February flew 17 sorties and 13.1 hours in support of I Corps ground forces. Severe monsoon weather was encountered during this period.

Flight operations were suspended on 17 February in observance of the Vietnamese Tet holiday truce.

Bomb damage assessment report by airborne and ground FAC's included 97 structures destroyed, 32 structures damaged, 95 bunkers destroyed, 19 bunkers damaged, 14 secondary explosions, 52 secondary fires, 6 automatic weapons positions destroyed, 5 trucks destroyed, 30 meters of trail, 80 meters of tree line, 395 meters of trenchline, 5 road cuts, 18 foxholes, 18 KBA, 1 20 foot flag pole and 1 NVA flag.

LtCol. F. E. PETERSEN Jr. was relieved by LtCol. T. R. MORGAN during a formal Change of Command Ceremony on 24 February 1969. During the ceremony BGen. H. W. HISE, Asst. Wing Commander, 1stMAW, presented the Minuteman Flag to LtCol. PETERSEN for the squadron's participation in the U. S. Savings Bond program. BGen. HISE also presented 1st Air Medals to 1stLt. M. A. REITSCH, 1stLt. H. J. RICHARDSON, 1stLt. J. A. NOLEN and 1stLt. T. R. JOHNSON and a Certificate of Commendation from the CG, 1stMAW to Cpl. N. A. OLSSON.
