

4. Important Visitors to the Command. NonePART III - Narrative Summary

November commenced the fourth month of combat operations at Chu Lai on the squadron's third combat tour in Vietnam. In general, weather conditions declined during November which restricted flight operations to 483 combat sorties, 538.4 combat hours and 1176.5 tons of ordnance delivered on the enemy.

Types of missions flown were Close Air Support and Direct Air Support missions in support of virtually all major ground operations in the I Corps Tactical Zone including Foster, Wheeler, Lancaster and Kentucky, interdiction missions in the A Shau Valley, Tally-Ho strikes in the North Vietnam panhandle, Steel Tiger interdiction strikes in Laos along the Ho-Chi-Minh Trail, TPQ-10 radar directed bombing missions plus a small number of helicopter escorts, landing zone preps, visual reconnaissances and air-to-air alert scrambles.

Enemy opposition slackened somewhat during November compared to the previous month, possibly due to unfavorable visibilities in deteriorating weather conditions. Nonetheless, three aircraft sustained battle damage; however, all were quickly repaired. There were no accidents and only one minor incident of an operational nature.

During November, there was a large officer turnover, particularly in the field grade ranks. Eight new officers joined while seven were transferred, and efforts were made to get these new members indoctrinated to combat operations as quickly as possible. Lastly, all departments were busy in preparation for an Administrative and Material Inspection to be held on 1 December.

Some highlight missions flown during November were:

Enclosure (1)

9 Nov: Major BROWN (RIO - Captain LEE) led a Steel Tiger strike into Laos with Captain DELAHOUSSAYE/Capt GRIMSHAW on wing and destroyed a road grader plus cutting a road.

18 Nov: Captain PATRICK (RIO - Captain BRANDON, WM - Captain BEST/Captain SHORE) destroyed three structures, damaged two more, damaged one and half tons of rice, and killed one enemy (confirmed) plus five more (probable) on a close air support for Operation FOSTER near An Hoa.

20 Nov: Capt BEST (RIO - Captain NORTHLICH, WM - Captain DELAHOUSSAYE/1stLt DAVIS) was scrambled off the hot pad to An Hoa where they accounted for 15 enemy killed by air (confirmed) plus three structures destroyed. Enemy reaction was intense and both aircraft were damaged by groundfire.

20 Nov: Major DREWLOW with Captains O'MARA, DRAGE and GRIMSHAW destroyed 12 structures and damaged 13 more on a close air support mission.

22 Nov: Major BOOZMAN (RIO - Lt KERR) led Captain O'BLOCK/Capt REYNOLDS on a close air support mission against Viet Cong in the open, destroying six structures and killing six of the enemy (probable) while receiving intense hostile fire.

24 Nov: Captains PATRICK, GLISAN, DELAHOUSSAYE and REYNOLDS flying support for ROK Marines south of Chu Lai, destroyed 16 structures, damaged one bunker, and killed two (probable) Viet Cong.

27 Nov: Captain PATRICK led another mission with Captains GRIMSHAW, THACKER, and HARE which destroyed four structures and killed four enemy (confirmed) plus three more (probable).

And on 8 November, Captain QUILTER killed two cows in the DMZ bringing his personal score up to three and confirming his reputation as the "hamburger king".
