4. Important Visitors to the Command

a. Major General ADAMS, Commanding General, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing, visited Chu Lai Air Base and the Marine Aircraft Group 13 area during the period 21-23 September.

PART II - Narrative Summary

During September VMFA-323 completed its fourteenth consecutive month of combat operations. The squadron flew the highest number of sorties of any unit in the Group. A total of 549 combat sorties were flown and these flights dropped a total of 1212.6 tons of ordnance.

During the month, VMFA-323 spent seven (7) days on the Air-to-Ground hot pad and seven (7) days on the Air-to-Air alert. Also, the airborne alert/CAP sorties which were begun in August were continued and provided timely assistance with a short reaction time.

A notable achievement during the month was that, although the sortie rate was above average when compared to the monthly mean for the year, no aircraft sustained battle damage. In fact, September marked the first calendar month of operation in Vietnam without a single aircraft receiving hits from enemy ground fire.

Some of the September highlight missions were:

On 7 September, LtCol. SLEE(pilot)/Capt. MURPHY(RIO) and Capt. PETERSEN (pilot)/1/Lt. MASSEY(RIO) flew a Close Air Support mission in support of the Special Forces in Quang Tin Province. Their accurate delivery of MK-81 Snakeye bombs and MK-77 Napalm resulted in the destruction of four (4) bunkers, one (1) AA position, one (1) observation post and a suspected mortar site.

On 19 September, Capt. HESS(pilot)/1/Lt. SIMPSON(RIO) and 1/Lt. MURPHY (pilot)/Capt. WEINRICH(RIO) flew a Direct Air Support TQ mission in support of the 7th Marines. The flight destroyed three (3) bunkers and 100 meters of trench line as well as being credited with four (4) enemy killed by air.
