

Following a general decline in offensive operations throughout the Republic of South Vietnam VMFA-334 had its slowest month since November 1968. Completing 546 combat sorties, the Falcons of 334 logged 661 hours for July, expendended 1110.9 tons of ordnance and supported operations Arlington Canyon, Campbell Streamer, Durham Peak, Frederick Hill, Geneva Park, Kentucky Jumper, Idaho Canyon, Iroquois Grove, Iron Mountain, Lamar Plain, Montgomery Rendezvous, Pipestone Canyon, Victory Dragon and Steel Tiger.

Some of the July mission highlights were:

On 7 July Captain D. P. BROWN and 1stLt R. D. HARCOURT (RIO) and their wingman Captain J. L. KING and 1stLt G. MENK (RIO) supporting the Americal Division under FAC control of Jake 43 were credited with twelve military structures destroyed, three structures damanged and four secondary fires.

On 24 July LtCol J. R. BRADDON and Captain K. E. STRAYHORN (RIO) and Captain D. H. MATZKO and 1stLt F. GRIFFIN (RIO) also under the control of Jake 43 successfully attacked an NVA base camp and destroyed fourteen structures, eight bunkers and two tunnel complexes and initiated a secondary fire.
