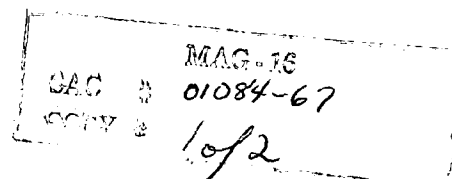

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 9 August: Capt. M. V. GRIFFITH and his wingman, Lt. B. L. GILLASPIE, received light sniper fire from YD 196818 while on a photography mission. Capt. GRIFFITH's aircraft received two hits, and Lt. GILLASPIE's aircraft received one hit. No one was injured and the mission was completed.
- 12 August: Capt. L. DELMORE and his wingman, Capt. J. R. ELKINS, received light sniper fire from YD 715255 while on a night med-evac mission.
- 13 August: Maj. C. H. F. EGGER, while leading a division on a morning strike, received light sniper fire from YD 530480. The aircraft received two hits. No one was injured and the mission was completed.
- 23 August: Lt. B. L. GILLASPIE, while returning from a early morning med-evac, received light sniper fire from YD 221613. The aircraft received three hits but no one was injured.
- 25 August: Capt. W. J. MCSHANE, while on an afternoon med-evac, received light sniper fire from YD 298735.
- 27 August: Capt. T. S. SIGLER, while on an afternoon resupply mission, received several mortar rounds from YD 970497, while in the landing zone. The aircraft was hit seven times, but no one was injured and the mission was completed.
- 28 August: Capt. L. B. MCDONOUGH, while on an afternoon resupply mission received one mortar round in the zone at YD 211731.
- 29 August: Capt. G. W. CUNNINGHAM, while on an early evening resupply mission, received light sniper fire from YD 240610.
- 31 August: Capt. L. DELMORE, while on an afternoon med-evac, received light sniper fire from YD 275500.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

28 August: Dong Ha Air Field and HMM-361 came under heavy enemy artillery and rocket fire at 0605H, 1133H, and 1845H. The Dong Ha complex received a total of 204 enemy artillery and rocket rounds. Damage to squadron aircraft was moderate with one aircraft completely destroyed by a direct hit. The squadron suffered the following WIA's:
