PART II - NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS DURING REPORTING PERIOD

Normal daily flight operations during this reporting period consisted of Med-Evac, Resupply, Aerial Recon and Admin/Liaison missions. The events listed took place during the course of these operations.

1 August 1967

At 1715H, YZ-65 encountered intense enemy fire from BT 272273 while on an emergency med-evac mission. The helicopter was hit in the tail rotor. The crew returned 200 rounds of 7.62 fire to the enemy and the mission was completed.

At 1930H, YZ-79, while on a med-evac mission to BT 186535, encountered intense enemy small arms and automatic weapons fire from BT 185535. The helicopter was hit five times. Among the areas hit were the fuel cell and the oil cooler. Because of the damage, the mission was aborted. No crewmen were reported injured.

At 1935H, YZ-82 successfully completed the above med-evac mission although enemy fire came from the same position. The helicopter sustained three hits in the wind screen and the clamshell door. The crew was uninjured and returned 100 rounds of 7.62 fire.

2 August 1967

At 1600H, YZ-67 encountered light enemy small arms fire originating from BT 183552 during a resupply mission. The helicopter sustained one hit in the tail rotor. The mission was completed.

3 August 1967

Routine flight operations were conducted with no incidents reported.

4 August 1967

At 1830H, YZ-65, while on a courier mission, encountered light enemy small arms fire enroute to a friendly position. The suspected origin of the enemy fire was BT 010518. No damage was reported.

5 August 1967

At 0900H, YZ-84 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 054638 while on a med-evac mission. The helicopter was hit in the fuel cell. No fire was returned and the mission was completed.

At 1000H, YZ-83, while on a med-evac mission, encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 015585 and was hit in the tail cone. The crew

returned 100 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

At 1300H, YZ-66 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 064634 while on a med-evac mission. The crew expended 100 rounds of suppressing fire. No damage was reported and the mission was completed.

At 1750H, YZ-66 encountered moderate enemy small arms fire from AT 997346 while on a med-evac mission. No damage was reported. The crew expended 100 rounds of 7.62 suppressing fire and the mission was completed.

6 August 1967

At 0215H, YZ-81 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 837822 while on a successful med-evac mission. No damage was reported and no fire was returned.

At 0815H, YZ-61 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 030632 while on a successful med-evac mission. No damage was reported and no fire was returned.

At 1150H, YZ-61 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 011572 while on a successful med-evac mission. No damage was reported and no fire was returned.

At 2000H, YZ-83 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 002308 while on a successful med-evac mission. No damage was reported.

7 August 1967

At 1130H, YZ-80 encountered intense enemy small arms fire from AT 965598 while on a med-evac mission. The helicopter was hit in the radio compartment and the crew chief received shrapnel injuries. The crew expended 20 rounds of 7.62 at the enemy. No further damage was reported and the mission was completed.

At 1730H, YZ-83 encountered enemy small arms fire from AT 990580 while on a successful med-evac mission. The crew expended 100 rounds of 7.62 and suppressed the enemy fire. No damage to the helicopter or injuries to the crew was reported.

At 1900H, YZ-83 encountered moderate enemy small arms fire from AT 986575 while on a successful med-evac mission. No damage was reported.

At 1930H, YZ-83 encountered light enemy small arms fire while on a successful med-evac mission. The crew expended 50 rounds of 7.62 fire.

At 2100H, YZ-83 encountered moderate enemy automatic tracer fire from AT 970575 while enroute to a med-evac zone. No damage was reported.

8 August 1967

Routine flight operations were conducted with no reported incidents.

9 August 1967

At 1425H, YZ-81 encountered intense enemy small arms fire and grenades from BT 025605 in a med-evac zone. The helicopter was hit once in the radio compartment. The crewmen fired 200 rounds of suppressing fire and when the crew chief's M-60 machine gun jammed, he pumped out 20 rounds of .45 with the co-pilot's sub-machine gun. The mission was completed successfully and with no further damage.

At 1645H, YZ-81 encountered moderate enemy automatic tracer fire from AT 902511 while flying a med-evac mission. The crew expended 100 rounds of 7.62 suppressing fire. No damage was reported.

10 August 1967

Routine flight operations were conducted with no reported incidents.

11 August 1967

At 1550H, YZ-66 encountered light enemy small arms and tracer fire from BT 120498 while on a med-evac mission. The crew returned 100 rounds of 7.62.

At 2035H, YZ-66 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 027602 while on a med-evac mission. No damage was reported.

12 August 1967

At 2030H, YZ-84 observed enemy muzzle flashes at AT 9758 while en-route to a med-evac zone.

13 August 1967

At 0700H, YZ-82 encountered intense enemy small arms and automatic weapons fire from AT 923502 while on a successful med-evac mission. The crew returned 100 rounds of 7.62. The helicopter was hit in the tail pylon; no further damage was reported.

At 1030H, YZ-71 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 108231 while approaching a med-evac zone. The mission was completed with no damage reported.

At 1850H, YZ-80 encountered light enemy fire from BT 015585 while approaching a med-evac zone and was hit in the aft fuel cell and in the

tail cone. No crew injuries were reported. The crew changed aircraft and completed the mission.

14 August 1967

At 0120H, YZ-80 encountered light enemy small arms tracer fire from BT 1330 while enroute to a med-evac zone. No damage was reported.

At 1100H, YZ-64 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 500680 while enroute to a resupply zone. No damage was reported and no suppressive fire was necessary.

At 2110H, YZ-65 encountered light enemy .50 caliber fire from AT 9148 while enroute to a med-evac zone. No damage was reported.

At 2150H, YZ-65 encountered more enemy .50 caliber fire from BT 0259 and climbed to evade the fire. No damage was reported.

15 August 1967

At 1130H, YZ-65 encountered light enemy small arms fire at BT 182565 on a med-evac mission. The helicopter sustained one hit which resulted in limited material damage. The co-pilot and crew chief were slightly wounded by shrapnel. The crew expended 50 rounds of 7.62 and the gunner claimed he eliminated the sniper. The mission was completed.

At 1730H, YZ-72 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 181567 while on a med-evac mission. The crew returned 50 rounds of suppressing fire. The helicopter was undamaged and the mission was completed.

At 1800H, YZ-72 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 070627 while departing a med-evac zone. No damage was reported.

16 August 1967

At 1530H, YZ-77 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 1434 while departing a resupply zone. No damage was reported.

17 August 1967

At 0835H, YZ-80 encountered moderate enemy automatic weapons fire from BT 070624 while departing a med-evac zone. The crew did not return fire and the helicopter was not hit.

18 August 1967

At 1135H, YZ-80 encountered light fire from AT 895504 while departing a med-evac zone. The crew did not return fire and the helicopter was not

damaged.

At 1945H, YZ-82 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 992596 while enroute to a med-evac zone. No damage was reported.

19 August 1967

At 0800H, YZ-72 encountered light small arms fire from AT 868230 during a strike. No damage was reported to the helicopter and no fire was returned.

At 2100H, YZ-81 encountered intense enemy automatic weapons fire from BT 054635 while on a med-evac mission. The crew returned 100 rounds of 7.62. No hits were sustained and the mission was completed.

20 August 1967

At 1525H, YZ-68 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 047600 while approaching a med-evac zone. No hits were sustained.

At 1600H, YZ-65 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 985275 while enroute to a med-evac zone. The helicopter sustained two hits in the main rotor blades. No fire was returned.

At 1630H, YZ-72 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 918220 while approaching a resupply zone. No hits were reported and no fire returned. The mission was completed.

At 1700H, YZ-77 encountered light enemy small arms fire at BT 110395 while enroute to a landing zone. No damage was reported.

21 August 1967

At 0715H, YZ-81 encountered moderate enemy small arms fire from AT 996618 while departing a med-evac zone. The helicopter sustained a hit on the port side just below the transmission door. No further damage was reported and the crew was uninjured.

At 0900H, YZ-63 encountered moderate enemy automatic weapons fire from BT 013628 during the morning courier run. The helicopter was hit in the cabin door and the courier received a bullet wound in the leg. The crew returned 50 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was aborted.

At 1100H, YZ-80 encountered moderate enemy small arms fire from AT 997634 during a med-evac mission. The crew returned 100 rounds of 7.62. No damage was reported. The mission was completed after the med-evacs were moved to a more secure zone.

22 August 1967

At 1045H, YZ-S2 encountered intense enemy small arms and automatic weapons fire from BT 025513 during a med-evac mission. The helicopter was hit five times with limited damage and the corpsman was wounded seriously in the chest. The crew chief and gunner returned 400 rounds of 7.62. The mission was completed.

At 1920H, YZ-78 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 960595 during a med-evac mission. The helicopter was hit in the tail pylon. The crew returned 50 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

At 2235H, YZ-77 encountered light enemy fire from AT 953645 when landing in a med-evac zone. The helicopter was hit in a main rotor blade pocket. No injuries were reported and the mission was completed.

23 August 1967

At 1930H, YZ-76 encountered light small arms fire from BT 090653 during the approach to a med-evac zone. No damage was reported. The mission was completed.

At 2055H, YZ-81 encountered light small arms fire from AT 997627 during a med-evac mission. The crew expended 50 rounds of 7.62. No damage was reported and the mission was completed.

24 August 1967

At 1950H, YZ-81 encountered light enemy automatic tracer fire from BT 137501 enroute to a med-evac zone. No damage was reported and the crew returned 75 rounds of 7.62.

25 August 1967

At 0915H, YZ-81 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 135560 departing a med-evac zone. No damage was reported. The crew expended 100 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

At 1000H, YZ-68 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 970370 enroute to a landing zone. No damage was reported.

26 August 1967

At 0950H, YZ-81 encountered moderate small arms fire from AT 845500 departing a med-evac zone. No damage was reported. The crew returned 400 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

At 1500H, YZ-74 encountered moderate enemy small arms fire and automatic weapons fire from BT 115627 in a med-evac zone. No damage was reported. The crew returned 250 rounds of 7.62 fire and the mission was completed.

27 August 1967

At 1250H, YZ-81 encountered light enemy small arms fire from AT 921475 departing a med-evac zone. No damage was reported. The crew returned 200 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

At 1850H, YZ-81 encountered intense small arms and automatic weapons fire from BT 001600 during a med-evac mission. No damage was reported. The crew returned 500 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

At 1930H, YZ-76 encountered moderate small arms fire from AT 938675 approaching a med-evac zone. No damage was reported. The crew returned 50 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

At 2130H, YZ-76 encountered light small arms fire from AT 972602 orbiting a med-evac zone. No damage was reported. The crew returned 50 rounds of 7.62 and the mission was completed.

28 August 1967

At approximately 0130H, Marble Mountain came under heavy enemy rocket attack. The squadron suffered one (1) KIA and 41 WIA's from the incoming rounds. One aircraft was completely destroyed and four received limited damage.

At 0200H, YZ-73 spotted intense enemy rocket fire from BT 048645 while enroute to a med-evac zone. The information was reported and artillery was called in on the position.

29 August 1967

At 1725H, YZ-69 encountered light enemy small arms fire from BT 205555 while enroute to a landing zone. No damage was reported.

30 - 31 August 1967

Routine flight operations were conducted with no reported incidents.
