b. The total fire incidents for the squadron were 35, of which 10 were hits. Enemy fire accounted for two of three helicopters lost during the month of March.

c. The number of spots reports increased over the reporting month compared to February. This Month's total was 64 spot reports. HML-367 accounted for 108 VC/NVA KIA(C) last month.

4 April 196817. TRAINING

a. GENERAL MILITARY SUBJECTS TRAINING. Classes were given to thirteen newly joined personnel and consisted of an intelligence brief, a general area brief and a weapons indoctrination brief. Intelligence briefs are given to all enlisted personnel each week approximately one and one-half hour per lecture.

b. TECHNICAL TRAINING. 449 hours of formal classes were given and 1331 hours of on-the-job training was accomplished.

c. PILOT TRAINING. Five newly joined pilots were given all lectures as prescribed by squadron SOP. One pilot renewed his instrument card. Two Pilots were NATOPS qualified. APM's are held 3 times weekly. Intelligence briefs and Escape and Evasion tactics are reviewed at each APM.

d. EDUCATION. 2 personnel enrolled in USAFI, and 10 personnel enrolled in MCI Courses.

20. SUPPLY. During the past thirty days bunkers were completed, to specifications. We have more sand bags at this office if, any are needed. The new metal racks have been furnished, everyone is still waiting for mattresses and wallockers. Paint is on order and should arrive soon so, the offices throughout the squadron can put on their new tactical markings.

23. AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE.

a. Aircraft availability for the month averaged 68%. Maintenance control issued 1287 Job Control Numbers for a total of 7960.3 completed manhours.

b. Approximately 130 reports and documents were processed by maintenance admin.

c. 3 maintenance people were transferred with 5 replacements.

d. Total flight hours for the month was 1279.0 hours.
