

PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

<u>l April</u>: Two armed helo missions flown in support of LCU resupply of Hue City. One VIP mission was flown for XRAY. Armed helo Sorties/Tasks 14/6:

2 April: Two armed helo missions flown in support of LCU resupply to Hue.

Armed helo Sorties/Tasks 28/12.

3 April: Two normal and one emergency recon extract and one recon insert flown.

Four sorties flown in support of Operation HOUSTON armed helo Sorties/Tasks 31/16.

Two structures were destroyed and four were damaged.

4 April: Two missions flown to classified areas in support of US ARMY SPECIAL FORCES. One TAC(A) mission was flown. Armed helo Sorties/Tasks for day 61/32. Ammunition expended 151 2.75 rockets and 10,700 7.62 rounds.

5 April: Sixteen sorties were flown in support of PRAIRIE FIRE, twelve sorties in support of operation HOUSTON, armed helo Sorties/Tasks 52/19.

6 April: Three armed escort missions were flown in support of recon operations. Fourteen sorties flown in support of PRAIRIE FIRE, armed helo Sorties/Tasks
