NARRATIVE SUMMARY
CLASSIFICATION

The month of June brought with it another record breaking period for HML-367. Two thousand, two hundred and six, and two tenths hours were flown by HML-367. HML-367 flew 5,270 sorties and accomplished 378 tasks. The time accumulated and accomplishments exceeded all previous months in which HML-367 has been an all Gobra squadron. Even though many hours were put on each of the aircraft, our Maintenance Department maintained an average availability of 86.3%.

HML-367 accounted for 69 confirmed enemy kills, and another 36 probable enemy kills. HML-367 destroyed 31 enemy hootches, 5 enemy bunkers, and 6 enemy boats. During these actions our aircraft sustained only two hits which were minor.

On 26 June 1970, HML-367 was honored with a visit by the Secretary of the Navy, the Honorable John R. CHAFFEE. He was given a thorough brief on the AH-1G's capabilities and missions.

The squadron had two engine failures during June. One occurred while taxiing and only minor damage occurred. The other one was in flight and sustained major damage.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

- 8 June 1970 - VT-10 received one small arms hit in main rotor. This was only minor damage.
- 12 June 1970 - VT-11 experienced an engine failure and sustained only minor damage. VT-5 experienced an engine failure in-flight and major damage to the aircraft resulted.
- 21 June 1970 - VT-13 received one small arms hit in main rotor and multiple fragmentation holes in left side of the aircraft.
- 26 June 1970 - The Secretary of the Navy, the Honorable John N. CHAFFIN visited HML-367. He received a concise brief on the capabilities and missions of the AH-1G.
