PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Marine Light Helicopter Squadron 367 continued throughout August to demonstrate a high level of professionalism by successfully accomplishing its assigned missions. A reduced tempo of operations and a more stringent adherance to CNO utilization standards, resulted in the squadron logging a total of 1730.6 flight hours. Squadron pilots flew 4070 sorties in completing 467 tasks.

During the month, HML-367 pilots accounted for 22 confirmed enemy kills and 20 probable enemy kills. Squadron aircraft were also credited with destruction of numerous bunkers, hootches and other enemy fortifications. A total of 31 individual fire incidents or anti-aircraft activities were directed at squadron aircraft resulting in 2 small caliber hits causing limited damage with no crew member receiving wounds.

Continuing its effort to maintain a high level of combat proficiency and in order to supplement the training of newly joined aviators, a squadron tactics board was convened which reviewed and updated squadron tactical operating procedures. Additionally, in compliance with higher directives, a more feasible combat oriented Training and Readiness Manual syllabus was created and forwarded through the appropriate chain of command.

No awards were presented during the month of August.
