## PART II. Narrative Summary

On 1 May 1967 Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463 departed CONUS aboard the USS TRIPOLI, LPH-10, for the Republic of South Viet Nam. After twenty-three(23) days at sea Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463 arrived at the Marble Mountain Air Facility for operations in the Republic of South Viet Nam with Marine Aircraft Group 16. The squadron off-loaded the majority of it's cargo utilizing CH-53's. The remainder was off-loaded by surface. On 24 May 1967, off-loading was completed with a total of 275.6 tons of cargo off-loaded in 314 sorties. After off-loading was completed, the squadron began normal operations. On 26 May 1967 two(2) CH-53's each received one(1) hit from small arms fire during the approach to the drop zone BT 318088 while carrying rice, fish oil, and ammunition in support of the ARVN's. A TAR mission of a UH-34 on 30 May 1967 was incomplete due to aircraft accident resulting in overhaul damage to one(1) CH-53A BuNo 153289. No injuries occurred.
