

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Flight Operations of HMH-463 showed a significant increase during the month of February, primarily because of the Squadron's participation in the Allied operations in Laos. A total of 3761 sorties and 358 tasks were flown in a total of 1183.9 hours. Of the 6613.3 tons of cargo carried, 6306.9 was external, and 306.4 internal. A total of 8890 passengers were carried, (4787 U. S., 3504 ROK Marines, 599 ARVN).

The Squadron completed 6 Tactical Aircraft Recoveries (TARS), 3 of which were administrative and 3 of which were field.

HMH-463 participated in 4 strikes, with a total of 10 aircraft taking parto

During the entire month, the Squadron was heavily committed to Operation Dewey Canyon II/Lam San 719. Specifically, the Squadron worked in support of the First ARVN Division in their efforts to cut the Ho Chi Minh Trail in Laos.

During this Operation, the Squadron specialized in heavy lifts, carrying 155mm howitzers, Dal bulldozers and large amounts of ammunition. The Squadron's aircraft often received heavy fire from .50 caliber machine guns, 23mm and 37mm anti-aircraft guns, and 82mm mortars. One aircraft was lost due to enemy action in this operation.

The biggest day for the Squadron was 8 February 1971, when 8 aircraft carried 1,035,700 pounds of cargo in support of this mission, with 2 aircraft carrying over 200,000 pounds each.

The description the Squadron made into Laos during February was about 15 miles.

22FEB71: One strike mission was flown with 2 aircraft participating.

23FEB71: One aircraft sustained 2 .30 caliber hits while on an administrative

mission and one aircraft sustained 2 hits from mortar fragments.

23FEB71: One aircraft was shot down by enemy mortar and automatic weapons

fire while on a resupply mission in Laos. The aircraft suffered strike damage, with no fatalities being suffered by the crew.

24FEB71: The Squadron was visited by BGen. QUINN.

25FEB71: Two aircraft took a total of 3 hits from mortar fragments while on

a resupply mission.
