# NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the month of May the "Heavy Haulers" flew 213 hours in 731 sorties completing 110 tasks. A total of 4366 passangers and 565.1 tons of cargo were transported, of which 499.5 tons were carried externally.
- 2. Prior to "Standing Down", scheduled for 18 May, the squadron maintenance personnel were deeply involved in cleaning and preparing the aircraft for embarkation, customs and agricultural inspections.
- 3. On 17 May a fifteen (15) plane fly-by was conducted over the Marble Mountain Air Facility. On 19 May three (3) aircraft were loaded aboard the USS Iwo Jima enroute to North Island for PAR. Two (2) aircraft were flown aboard the USS Debuque (LPD-8) enroute to Okinawa on the 21st of May, while on the 26th of May the remaining thirteen (13) aircraft were flown to the USS Okinawa (LPH-3) on their way to MAC-24 MCAS Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii.

- 29 May The Squadron Colors departed the Republic of Vietnam to Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii via Ckinawa.
