MOSCOW--Spokesman for official Soviet tourist agency says Russian police have detained American tourist Bernard Koten in Kiev pending investigation of morality charge; American Embassy is checking.

KUALA LUMPUR--Malaya, Singapore, North Borneo and Sarawak agree to September 16 as new date for birth of Malaysia; say they will wait no longer.

MIRI, SARAWAK--3,000 anti-Malaysia demonstrators clash with police when survey team arrives.

SUVA, FIJI--Sir Kenneth Maddocks, governor of Fiji, opens first South Pacific games.

LISBON--Undersecretary of State George Ball arrives for two days of talks with Portuguese government leaders.
