

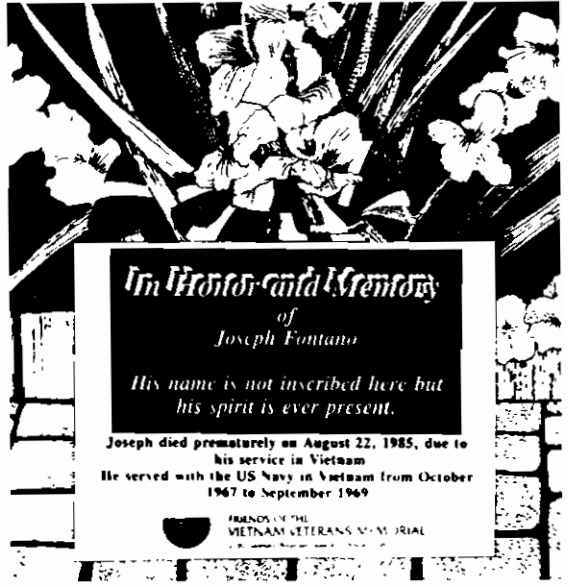
2) A bound leather album containing the second photo and a brief biography will be kept at our Information and Assistance Table near the Memorial, available for visitors to see and know about your loved one.

In addition, The Friends have a traditional memorial gift program similar to the programs of other major non profit organizations. Families can request that contributions be made to the Friends, in memory of the individual. If the contribution is made by persons other than family members, the individual's family will be notified that a Gift has been made in honor of their loved one, unless the donor requests that such notification be withheld.

In Memory . . .

In Memory is a unique memorial program which honors those who served and died as a result of the war in Vietnam, but whose names are not on the Memorial.

Thousands who served in Vietnam returned home only to die prematurely as a result of their tour in Vietnam. Some of these deaths were due to Agent Orange exposure and others were due to physical or emotional wounds received in Vietnam. The deaths of these individuals are no less tragic than those that occurred in country, but their names do not appear on the Wall.

Countless civilians were killed in Vietnam as well or returned home to die prematurely as a result of their emotional or physical wounds -- State Department employees, journalists, advisors -- and others whose names will never appear on the Wall.

The Friends have initiated a program to honor these veterans and civilians, a program which will place their names at the Memorial so that all who visit will know that they are with their honored comrades.

The *In Memory* program consists of two parts: 1) The Friends will place information about your loved one at the Memorial. For military veterans, the information will be placed at the panel corresponding to service time in country. For civilians, the information will be placed at the panel representing date of casualty or dates of service.

Information should include the following:

- Letter or letters about the individual
- Any information available regarding his or her service in Vietnam
- *In Memory* data form, supplied by the Friends
- At least one picture of the individual (2 would be better)

The material will be duplicated, so that one copy can be kept by the Friends for our records. The original materials will be put in a special envelope, sealed, and placed at the Memorial, where it will be collected by a Park Service Ranger and archived as a permanent reminder of your loved one.
