

A hippie woman in San Francisco handed me this announcement in late October 1969. She invited me to join the demonstration. I said, 'Thanks for the invitation. I won't be able to make it since I will be out of the country.' She smiled and moved on. I shipped out from Oakland to Vietnam about 28 October. After in-country processing in Long Binh, the Army transferred me to 1/77 Armored Battalion, 1/5 Brigade [Mechanized] where I was battalion surgeon in Quang Tri and at Charlie 2 [north of Cam Lo and south of Alpha-4, Con Thien]. In June 1970, I was transferred to 91st Evacuation Hospital, Chu Lai, Vietnam, except for two weeks TDY at Kham Duc near the Laotian border in August 1970. I returned to The World in October 1970 and finished my Army service at Sandia Army Base, Albuquerque, New Mexico.
