As we approach the 30th Anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War, and of "Operation Babylift", I believe that my website will provide a "safe harbor" for all those involved in Babylift, and for those who wish additional details about this extraordinary event.

During a period of approximately three weeks in April, 1975 over 2,500 Vietnamese War orphans were evacuated to the United States and several European countries at great personal risk to those who participated in the evacuation.

The lives of these children, who were "in harm's way", during the ensuing 30 years, is a testimony to the humanitarian outreach that Babylift exemplified.

The Babylift adoptees have changed the "complexion" of the United States, and the Babylift effort, as chronicled in my website, is one of the most important events of the Vietnam War and, of the 20th century.
