after noon, I don't have all

it seems he hit around  
2 A.M. with the mortars  
only. It was enough.  
Better wear a life jacket on  
the cruise. These navy ships  
are old. Really too bad that

you are going to the med-  
 now all the lovely girls  
 there will confuse you so  
 you won't know whether you  
 prefer another med service  
 or return to USDPAC for
