**The American POWs** by Samuel Kim, Branden Press, 273 pages, \$9.75. Writing from personal experience, Kim, himself an escaped prisoner of the Vietcong, has created an indelible saga of human adaptability and courage wrought of the brutality of Vietnam.

**Falcons Three** by Gilbert L. Parker, Vintage, 154 pages, \$6.95. Though fiction, this probing tableau of the Vietnam War and what it was like for both sides draws heavily from the author's own personal experiences. The sordid realities of that conflict, accurately depicted, enable the reader to better grasp the cruel fiasco of that no-win war.

This is the story of Stratton's six-year ordeal and of the shocking treatment meted out to him and other American POWs by the North Vietnamese. Also examined is the ordeal endured by Stratton's family and the unshakable faith which enabled those affected to believe in his eventual return.
