The teams were supported and coached by various US Army units including primarily the 16th General Support Group and the 2nd Bn, 508th Infantry. Essential equipment such as balls, bats, gloves, and some uniforms were supplied by the military units. Trophies for the tournament were also supplied by the Army and included one for each team plus a 'Most Valuable Player' trophy.

playing in the 7-game elimination series
The six teams came from villages and/or suburbs of Santo Domingo. The eventual winner was the team from Arroyo Hondo with the Villa Francisca team taking second place. *15 professional baseball rules were used throughout the league's season*

Following the championship game on Sunday afternoon, representatives of USFORDCOMREP and the 16th General Support Group presented the several trophies. USFORDCOMREP Chief of Staff, Colonel F.P. Field and 16th Commanding Officer, Colonel Darrell G. Wood handed out the trophies with the assistance of 1st Lt Richard Sites, Sports Director and tournament organizer.

The last trophy to be handed out went to the most valuable player. He was Miguel Montonuo, first baseman for the Champion Arroyo Hondo team.

As of the end of this tournament, [redacted] the Dominican Police Athletic Association assumed sponsorship of the teams.
