is practically out of the question. So look like those purchases shall have to be postponed indefinitely - not that it upsets me too much. If I'm not going anywhere - could do well without a camera until I do go. And I really don't have time to make or hear many tapes as it stands now anyway. Maybe I'll get these things later in my stay, but as long as it doesn't disappoint you terribly, it just doesn't shake me up at all.

Raises one other problem tho. With nothing to spend money on, I'll be collecting too much' (& the only thing I can buy right here is a \$40 & haircut and \$2.00 cases of pop or beer). Oh, yes, there is a restaurant over at the airborne unit

next to us - they serve

I work evenings & that
spots that. So, I'll either
have to start sending the
money home direct or increase
your allotment. - either way,
after I get a comfortable
sum of about \$200, I'll send
all else home, OK? Oh,
and after 4 mos. I should
get a - 4 which not only
means \$ more pay for me
but also increases your
regular check (base - not
counting my additions like
the last \$50) from \$100
to nearly \$200. Leastways
live off me if need be &
we should clear this cash
debt quickly next fall
& have anything done to it
that may arise. Her I go

talking money & no love. I
gust your bod - how's that?
Getting settled in the barracks.
Got a mattress today - should
be better than a leaky can
one on our wooden bunks.

Here it is midnite &
starting of 25th March and you're
still in the morning of 24th.
Hope its a good day for you.

colder back home. Well, you
can snuggle up to a warm
book & a cup of coffee &
write me a long letter
between intellectual work hours.
