

Guest Speaker...Adrian Cronauer

Former U.S. Air Force sergeant, Adrian Cronauer co-authored the original story for the motion picture, **Good Morning Vietnam!** In that film, Cronauer was portrayed—loosely—by Robin Williams whose performance was nominated for an Academy Award. A subsequent special on National Public Radio about the role of military radio in Vietnam earned Cronauer a 1992 Ohio State Award and two 1991 Gold Medals from the New York Radio Festival.

A popular after-dinner speaker and lecturer, Cronauer periodically appears as a guest on radio and television talk shows, including NBC-TV's Today; the PBS series, Freedom Speaks; Hennity & Colmes on the Fox News Channel, and on the Oliver North and G. Gordon Liddy radio programs. Mr. Cronauer holds a law degree from the University of Pennsylvania and was a senior partner in a law firm in Washington DC. He has published several works in law journals and is considered an expert on communication and information law.



Currently he is now Special Assistant to the Director of the Pentagon's POW/MIA Office. In addition to Saturday nights appearance, he will speak about the POW/MIA issue Saturday afternoon. See the Schedule of Events for the time and place.

The Nevada Silver Tappers



This over 50-dance troupe are not professional entertainers; they only perform like they are. Unofficially known as "the Sweethearts of Nye County," they were organized in 1989 in Pahrump Nevada by their Artistic Director, B.J. Hetrick-Irwin. Although some members have had dance training as children, the majority have learned their tap steps and choreography through twice a week classes at her studio.

As a non-profit volunteer group, the Nevada Silver Tappers are not paid for their appearances. Each member is responsible for the cost of individual costumes. Donations are accepted to defray the cost of travel and meals. They are much in demand for community festivals, conventions, and fund raising events. They have also performed for the Nevada Governor's Ball

Their performance will include several patriotic numbers that reflect the American way of freedom of expression and the freedom to pursue your dreams.






LINEAGE

Constituted 24 May 1942 in the Army of the United States as Headquarters, Americal Division. Activated 27 May 1942 in New Caledonia. Inactivated 12 December 1945 at Fort Lawton, Washington. Re-designated 1 December 1954 as Headquarters, 23rd Infantry Division, and allotted to the Regular Army. Activated 2 December 1954 at Fort Amador, Canal Zone. Re-designated 25 September 1967 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 23rd Infantry Division, and activated in Vietnam. Inactivated 29 November 1971 at Fort Lewis, Washington.

LOOKING BACK ...

As events in our two wars became history, the record often necessarily surpassed individual efforts that went into executing the entire mission.

Discrete events and accomplishments are lost as figures in black and white on some report that is skimmed and filed.

But each of us treasures some moment we consider unique, perhaps because it was part of our own, more personal mission.

Such is this record; happenings which are, alone, small fractions of the whole. Events that could only happen at our own particular place in time and which will be remembered only by two separate groups of people, two generations ... who worked together in a quest for freedom.
