

1. (U) Name of Operation: SANTA FE Phases I,II,III (1st Bde, 9th Inf Div).

2. (U) Dates of Operation: 030600 Nov 1967 to 051525 Jan 1968.

3. (C) Location: East of Xuan Loc, South of Hwy 1, North of Ham Tan in the MAY TAO SECRET Zone, South of EW grid line 06, North of EW grid line 67, East of NS grid line 67 and West of NS grid line 19. Reference: Map Vietnam, 1:50,000 sheets 6430 I,II,III, and IV.

4. (C) General: During the period 3 Nov 1967 to 5 Jan 1968, Opn SANTA FE was conducted by the 1st Bde, 9th Inf Div. The First Brigade conducted Opn SANTA FE, in the MAY TAO SECRET ZONE to locate and destroy the 5th VC Div, cleared trails to provide ready access to and aerial surveillance of the Brigade AO and to upgrade Hwy #1. The 2-47 (M) Inf, 4-39 Inf, 3-5 Cav were units under 1st Bde, 9th Inf Div control. Also operating in close cooperation and coordination with 1st Bde was the 18th Division (ARVN) and TF BINH TUY (ARVN).

Of significance is the fact that the normal direct combat engineer support to the maneuver elements, in the form of demo work, LZ clearing, water supply, expedient bridging and fire support construction, continued without interruption.

8. INTELLIGENCE:

a. Pre & Operational Intelligence Information.

(1) Friendly operations in the area of interest can expect to encounter Hqs 5th VC Div with its administrative and combat support units located vic YS7793. Support elements include a hospital complex (T1500) and the 50th Trng Bn believed located vic YS7490. According to a rallie, HO VAN VANG, the 2d Bn 274th VC Regt is in the Cam My Jungle. However, the 11th ACB operations in that area may have forced them to move probable location along the Song Rai vic YS6393. The 84th Rear Services Group and possibly two companies of 0445 Ba Bien Bn are reported north of Thua Tich and along the Song Rai vic YS6084. The 1st Bn 275th VC Regt could be providing security for Hqs 5th VC Div, off in Long Thanh Province north of Gia Ray. Other reports indicate a RM IV main force battalion from Binh Thuan Province in the vic YS8885, replacing a 5th Div battalion that is on a special mission.

(2) Elements of the 274th VC Regt located in the HAT DICH 0445 BA Bien Bn and elements of the 275th Regt located in Long Kanh could reinforce.

(3) The probable course of action will be avoid friendly operations, to divert and disorganize friendly forces utilizing mines and booby traps and harassing fires, and to remain fairly close while waiting for targets of opportunity to attack or ambush. If forced to withdraw, the enemy will withdraw to the east or northeast.

(8) 071721 A/4-39th Inf vic YS777895 found VC base camp consisting of 6 bunkers (8'x5'x5'). Also destroyed 37 chicom grenades, and evac 5 lbs documents, 1 can unidentified medical supplies.

(9) Delayed entry 0713 6 B/4-39th Inf vic YS813865 found 1 tunnel (12' deep). A search of the area 080900 Nov 67 resulted in finding 1 sq size VC base camp consisting of 3 bunkers w/o hc, also 2 forked poses in the ground (suspected AA support). Tunnel and bunkers destroyed.

(10) 080830 A/4-39th Inf vic YS780882 destroyed 3 huts and 4 bunkers w/o hc. Also in the area found well used trail. Area checked w/neg results.

(11) 080930 A/4-39th Inf vic YS778884 destroyed 16 huts, 15 bunkers w/o hc, and 1 rd AK-47 ammo. A search of the area revealed an old map of area and 3 well used trail. Area checked w/neg results. Map evac.

(12) 081342 C/2-47th Inf (M) vic YS767920 dest 11 huts, 11 bunkers, misc clothing and evac 2 documents. Bunkers were old but appeared to have been recently used.

(13) 111105 C/2-47th Inf (M) vic YS800920 destroyed 5 huts, 3 bunkers, 3 misc cooking utensils, and misc BA 30's.

(14) 111400 A/4-39th Inf vic YS781878 destroyed 5 bunkers (3'x3'x4'), 3 bunkers (8'x18x4') w/o hc, 5 huts, 20 rds M-1 ammo, assorted clothing, 1 table and evac 4 lb documents and 1x1 DH 5 lb claymore w/wire, 1 ear phone set CIC dated 26 May 1959, 1 long line antenna.

(15) 121417 C/2-47th Inf (M) vic YS770938 destroyed VC base camp consisting of 3 huts and 2 bunkers w/o hc; also vic YS770937 additional 9 huts and 8 bunkers. Evac 1 poncho, 1 gas mask, 1 piece of web gear and misc pots, 2 misc documents. Documents include a personnel roster of ammunition and type weapon issued to each individual, 9x S'S type 56 and 4 AK-47 assault rifles.

(16) 131230 A/4-39th Inf vic YS766885, destroyed 8 bunkers (3'x4'x3'), 5 huts (10'x8'x5') and 2 latrines. Also evacuated 100 lbs rice, 25 lbs of beans, 1 gal bean oil (US), 2000' field wire, 2 RPG rocket rds, 2 Yugoslavian TM 50 telephones.

(17) 131425 C/2-47th Inf (M) vic YS771925 located 10 bunkers (8x4x3) w/o hc, 3 huts.

(18) 151145 1st C&C ship rep't large VC base camp complex vic approx location YT74 ..

(19) 161245 C/4-39th Inf vic YS781782 found VC base camp containing 13 bunkers and 3 huts. Engaged 3 VC with neg results. Also found 2 chicom claymores, 4 hand grenades, 300 rds AK-47 and 7.62 amo, 1 large grenade, 50 lbs of rice, misc amount medical supplies, and unk amount of documents. The documents were extracted and the remainder left intact and an ambush patrol was established. Follow-up: destroyed bunkers and huts and evacuated the remainder 17 Nov.

(20) 171000 B/4-39th Inf vic YS774844, found VC base camp consisting of 30 bunkers 2 to 3 weeks old, 1 classroom for approx 80 people, 5 cooking huts and misc clothing. Also found 20 lbs medical supplies, 2 lbs of documents, 1 map, and 1 training manual, 1 home made hand grenade, 50 rds of 50 cal armor piercing ammo, 1 box for 81mm mortar sight. The bunkers, huts classroom and clothing were destroyed and the remainder evacuated.

(21) 180830 B/4-39th Inf vic YS771847, located base camp consisting of 12 bunkers (10'x10') w/ohc and 1 classroom for approx 75 people, also destroyed 2 rds 75mm RR, 2 chicom claymores and 26 CBU&s. Bunkers and classroom were not destroyed due to mission.

(22) 201055 B/4-39th Inf vic YS735895 found 15 graves approx 3 days old. Graves contained 7 VC KIA (BC) by arty and 8 VC KIA (BC) by SA fire.

(23) 221105 A/2-47th (M) Inf vic YS803418, destroyed 8 huts, 20 bunkers, 1 tunnel and evacuated small amount medical supplies and 3 documents. In searching area found base camp vic YS811920, consisting of 20 bunkers and 7 huts.

(26) 290010 1st Bde S-4 rpt Xuan Loc rec'd 45 rds S1/82mm mortar and SA & AW fire. Fire came from NW, appeared to be trying for a ammunition dump. Mortar ceased at 0124H; neg friendly cas, there were 5 2½ ton lightly damaged.

(27) 051640 43rd ARVN rpt fresh trenches in vic YS2193; YS2195; YS234933; and 5 rectangular trenches (3x6) vic YS220953; and 30 trenches near Hwy 340 vic YS220953.

(28) 121325 LNO TF NGOC vic 085976 fd rice cache containing 660 lbs of rice. Rice was destroyed.

(29) 151150 A/2-47th (M) Inf vic YS053983 destroyed 2 small punji pits, 2 huts, 150 lbs rice, grinding machine, 20 lbs rice evac.

(30) 160955 LNO TF BINH TUY rpt I&R plt vic 25 078978 rec'd SA/AW fire from plt size unit. VC broke contact at 1005H and fled SW; VC wearing blk PJ's and khaki uniforms w/shoulder harnesses. Results: 2 friendly WIA's, 6 VC KIA and 1 Chicom grenade captured; no unit ID on bodies.

(31) 281135 A/2-47 (M) Inf vic 25 101992, dest 3 bunkers (10x4x5) 3 huts and evac 2 anti-personnel mines

(33) 301000 LNO TF Binh Tuy rpt to LNO 1-11 Arty that ARVN sighted approx 500 VC YS9490. Hwy conducted VR and searched area without results.

(34) 301200 LNO TF Binh Tuy rpt to 1-11th Arty that approx 500 VC loc vic YS895925. Arty fired into area. Army conducted VR and rec'd SA fire vic YS914911, neg hits; aircrafts continued mission. Air strike was placed vic YS914911.

c. Weather: During the operation, weather had no significant impact on military operations. Approximately 36 hours of rain temporarily; delayed the trail clearing operation south of the May Tao Mountain area.

d. Conclusions: The results of the operation did not substantiate previous intelligence information regarding the 5th VC Division. There was insignificant sporadic contact during phase 1. The lack of booby traps along trails and base camp areas indicated the VC attached little importance to the area. Equipment and documents captured and evacuated were deteriorated. From all indications, the base camps were vacated before Operation SANTA FE was initiated.

9. MISSION: The 1st Bde attacks H-Hour D-Day to destroy VC/NVA forces and installations in zone in the MAY TAO SECRET ZONE; clears and upgrades Hwy 1 on order.

10. Concept of Operation:

a. During the period 3 November 1967 to 5 January 1968 the 1st Bde conducted strike ops in the SANTA FE area with forces ranging from one Mech Inf Bn to one Mech Inf Bn, one Cav Sqdn, and an ARVN TF consisting of 2 ARVN Ranger Bn's to locate and destroy elements of the 5th VC Div in the MAY TAO SECRET ZONE. To provide security for the 15th and 86th Engrs building bridges and clearing jungle along Hwy 1 to open that route and clearing trails along Rte 331 and Rte 2B to provide ready access to the MAY TAO SECRET ZONE and the village of HAM TAM and TAM TAN.

b. Maneuver:

(1) Phase I: from 3 Nov 1967 to 13 Nov 1967. The 1st Bde conducted AML assault and ground assault into the MAY TAO SECRET ZONE to locate and destroy elements of the 5th VC Div.

(2) Phase II: from 13 Nov 1967 to 1 Dec 1967. Conducted ops south of Hwy 1 along Rte 331 to locate and destroy elements of the 5th VC Div and to clear trails in area to provide ready access to the MAY TAO SECRET ZONE.

(3) Phase III: from 1 Dec 1967 to 5 Jan 1968. Conducted assault, both AML and ground, to seize and secure the bridge sites along Hwy 1 from FS/PB WILDCAT to the Corp boundary. To build and repair bridges along Hwy 1 to open Hwy 1 to the Corp boundary.

11. EXECUTION:

3 Nov: The FIRST AND FOREMOST commenced Opn SANTA FE to locate and destroy the 5th VC Div and to provide security for Engrs clearing jungle along Hwy 1 on order. Conducted Bn (-) AML aslt and moved overland with one Bn to seize and secure Obj 1 and establish and secure FS/PB WILDCAT vic YS817967. Attached on order to seize Obj 2. The 4-39 Inf conducted Bn (-) AML aslt from Long Thanh airstrip commencing 0825H and landed on LZ 1 vic YS817967 and seized obj 1. Upon link-up with 2-47 (M) Inf at FS/PB WILDCAT, attacked to the south in zone to seize Obj 2 vic YS792938 without contact. 2-47 (M) Inf provided security for the First Brigade elements from Bearcat to FS/PB WILDCAT and dropped off the First Brigade Trains at Xuan Loc without contact. D Troop 3-5 Cav provided LFT support during the move and screened to the northeast in zone. The Aero Rifle Platoon was inserted vic YS917947 and searched that area without contact.

4 Nov: The FIRST AND FOREMOST continued Opn SANTA FE with 2 Bn's and an Air Cav Troop to locate and destroy the 5th VC Div and to provide security for Engrs clearing Jungle and opening Hwy 1 on order. The 4-39 Inf conducted S&D ops in zone and conducted cloverleaf patrols from Obj 2 vic 7993 to locate and destroy VC forces in that area. During the hours of darkness the Bn conducted ambush patrols in zone to interdict trails and avenues of withdrawal in that area without contact. The Bn assumed OPCON B Company 2-47 (M) Inf effective 041030H. A Company conducted S&D ops vic YS7992 and conducted ambush patrols in that area without contact. B Company conducted S&D ops vic YS7992 and conducted ambush patrols in that area without contact. C Company conducted S&D ops vic YS7893 and secured the Bn CP. E Company conducted S&D vic YS7891 and established ambushes in that area to interdict trails and routes of withdrawal without incident. B Company 2-47 (M) Inf became OPCON 4-39 Inf 041030H and secured the Rome plows cutting a trail from YS815963 to YS788934 to be used as an LOC between FS/PB WILDCAT and PANTHER without incident. The 2-47 (M) Inf continued S&D ops in zone and conducted screening ops on Hwy 1 in sector to locate and destroy VC forces in that area. The Bn also interdicted likely avenues of withdrawal in zone. The 2-47 (M) Inf provided security for FS/PB WILDCAT and the Bde CP vic YS817967 and released B Company OPCON 4-39 Inf 041030H. A Company conducted local S&D in zone vic YS8198 and conducted ambush patrols along Hwy 1 northeast in zone. The company also provided security for FS/PB WILDCAT and the Bde CP without contact. Company C provided one platoon to assist the Scout platoon on convoy escort from FS/PB WILDCAT to Xuan Loc. The company also conducted S&D ops vic YS7897 and outposting of Hwy 1 in sector without contact. D Troop 3-5 Cav conducted S&D ops vic YS8697 with the Aero Rifle Platoon without contact. D Troop provided air screen in zone and inserted the IRRP in AO BLUE JAY I and AO BLUE JAY II without sightings or contact.

5 Nov: Opn SANTA FE was continued by elements of the First Brigade. The 4-39 Inf continued S&D ops in zone to locate and destroy VC forces in the area. Company A conducted S&D ops vic YS7790 without incident. B Company conducted S&D in zone with one report of contact in the vic YS787916. Contact was with an estimated 3 to 4 VC. Contact was broken after 2 minutes by the VC. B Co pursued the VC but could not re-establish contact; there were no casualties in the engagement. C Company conducted S&D ops vic YS7992 without contact. E Company conducted S&D ops in zone with one reported contact. At 0810H the company exchanged fire with 2 VC. The VC broke contact and fled to the north. E Co pursued and spotted 4 to 6 more VC but was unable to establish contact; there were no casualties in the contact. B Company 2-47 (M) Inf remained OPCON 4-39 Inf and conducted S&D ops vic YS7892. The company also secured the Bn CP and the Rome plow effort in that area without contact. The 2-47 (M) Inf conducted S&D ops in zone to locate and destroy the 5th VC Div. The Bn secured FS/PB WILDCAT and provided convoy escort from WILDCAT to Xuan Loc.

D Troop 3-5 Cav extracted the LRRP from AO without incident and was released OPCON TF FONSYTH effective 050600H.

13. ADMINISTRATION:

a. The administration planning of Operation SANTA FE proved to be sound and the logistical combat service support was effective throughout the operation. However, adjustments were necessary in the Class I, III and medical support areas for PHASE III of the operation. Palletized dry and canned vegetables were positioned at XUAN LOC (YT468084) to substitute for contingencies brought about by logistical convoys. Class III, 3 ten thousand gallon bladders, were positioned at FSB WILDCAT (YT817966) to expedite resupply of supported units and helicopters in support of the mission. Medical support from B Company 9th Medical Battalion was displaced from XUAN LOC to FSB WILDCAT in order to provide more effective service. The logistical base of support Class I-IV was

The most significant detrimental factor during the operation was the long distance of the resupply route and its condition. (3) There were difficulties noted during the operation in that one aircraft was deemed inadequate for aerial resupply and contingency missions.

f. Services:

(1) Water:

(a) Erderlators were placed at XUAN LOC, FSB WILDCAT, and for Phase III FSB PUMA (YT895990) because of the long distance involved, approximately 115 KM to the most distant resupply point. During the final phase of SANTA FE it was necessary to displace the water point located at FSB PUMA (895990) to FSB CONG KI (735000). These erderlators purified a total of 37,140 gallons potable water.

(b) Non-potable water sources in forward areas were purified on an individual basis by use of iodine cholorine tablets.

(c) Metal and plastic five gallon containers were utilized during the operation.

(2) Graves Registration:

(a) The Co "A", 9th S&T Bn Graves Registration Section was initially located at XUAN LOC and was later moved up to FSB WILDCAT along with the medical section to provide better service.

(b) The Graves Registration Section processed 0 U.S. remains.

(3) Bath

(a) There were two bath sections in operation during the operation provided and operated by CO "A" 9th S&T Bn. They were located at XUAN LOC and FSB WILDCAT, combined they bathed 156,000 personnel during the period of the operation.

(i) Laundry

(a) A laundry facility was established at the Bde Trains area located at XUAN LOC by the 483rd Fld Service Co. This unit provided laundry service for all units located in the field on this operation.

(b) There was a total of 2,063 bundles of laundry washed.

(c) Some personnel used individual laundering of clothing.

14. CIVIC ACTIONS: There was no civic action program conducted on operation SANTA FE. A limited program was continued in AO RILEY by the First Brigade rear detachment.

15. COMMANDERS EVALUATION: Operation SANTA FE was an overall success although it failed to locate, fix and destroy the 5th VC Division. However, many of their base locations and lines of communication were found and destroyed. Constant saturation patrolling and artillery harassment and interdictory fires succeeded in fragmenting those small elements left in the Brigade AO. Jungle clearing south of Highway 1 on Route 331 provided the widened trails and mutually supporting FS/PB's necessary for future airmobile or surface assaults. The highpoint of the operation was the security and upgrading operations along Highways 1 and 2B. These major routes of communication and commerce had not been used since 1962 due to the destruction of most of the eleven bridge sites in the 1st Brigade AO. During the latter phase of operation SANTA FE one-hundred meters of jungle on both sides of Highways #1 and 2B were cleared and burned for a distance of 81 kilometers. All bridges were upgraded to sustain civilian traffic and the road surface was improved. Following the visit of Vice-President Ky on 19 December for the official opening of the highway, the flow of civilian traffic mounted to 175-200 asserted vehicles daily. The population center of XUAN LOC in the west was again connected with PHAN THIET, HAM TAN and TAM TAN in the east--thus connecting SAIGON with PHAN THIET on the China sea coast. Relocation of families and the reestablishment of commerce took place concurrently with the return of this area to the control of the GVN. This operation proved that the rejuvenating of commerce, return of areas to governmental control and upgrading of public facilities are as much a part of the stability operations in Vietnam as a direct confrontation with a large enemy force. Operation SANTA FE evolved into a monumental engineering effort taxing the leadership, ingenuity, morale and alertness of the First Brigade. However, the officers and men met the challenge in every respect. The accomplishments of the operation contributed much to the overall war effort.

8. Intelligence:

a. Preoperational Intelligence Information

(1) Elements of the 1st and 2d Bn of the 274th VC Regt are believed dispersed in the area of operation; it is possible some elements of the 2d Bn are located vic YS1179. The 3rd Bn is unlocated but probably south of Rt 1. LRRP on 1 Dec 67 reported an occupied base camp center of mass vic YS292835. On 8 Dec 67 vic YS308635, LRRP engaged a VC squad dressed in black trousers and light colored shirts armed with AK-47's. A LRRP engaged an unknown size VC force vic YS297832 on 2 Jan 68. Analysis of available intelligence indicate the VC are probably company/platoon locations with center of masses vic YS318845; YS285865; YS270895. (This follows the pattern indicated company locations are separated approximately 150 to 250 meters apart and 2 to 4 kilometers between battalions and regimental Headquarters. II FFORCEV PERINREP 46).

(2) Strengths and Weaknesses:

(a) The 274th Regt is strengthened by its knowledge of the terrain and by its complete control of the hinter land.

(b) The VC are able to disperse their installations and personnel widely because of the dense concealment offered by dense forested areas, yet concentrate rapidly on a well developed trail system to accomplish a mission.

(c) However, the VC are vulnerable to massive allied fire power. Order of Battle research indicates that the estimate strength of the 1st Bn, 274th VC Regt is 300. According to PW's captured by the RCMR, the strength of the 1st Bn, 274th Regt is approximately 150. If the regiment has been in the Hat Dich since August, malaria has probably weakened a high percentage of personnel. The rigors of jungle living are not generous and morale is probably low, making the enemy vulnerable to an aggressive PSYOPS Program.

b. Enemy Capabilities:

(1) The enemy can:

(a) Attack friendly forces entering the area with elements of 2 battalions supported by the appropriate share of Regimental Artillery and 81/82mm mortars.

(b) Reinforce within 24 - 36 hours with the D445 Bn and 3rd Bn, 274th Regt.

(c) Defend critical base areas with available forces.

(d) Avoid contact with friendly units yet remain in the area of operation.

(e) Attempt to withdraw from the area of operations.

(2) Analysis and Discussion:

(a) Attack: with forces available is unlikely because the concentration of force necessary to attack would present a lucrative target to artillery and airstrikes. An attack is unlikely to occur unless friendly forces present a target of opportunity in a vulnerable location: ie, an isolated company/platoon position. The attack would probably commence between 2400H and 0200H as a night assault against a perimeter.

(b) Reinforce: Historically, reinforcement of engaged units with other VC forces in the area is unlikely and is not practiced.

(c) Defense: Other than delay or harassment is not likely because of the vulnerability to massed artillery fires and close airstrikes. If trapped or threatened by encirclement the VC will attempt to break out by night assault between 2400 and 0300H.

(d) Withdraw: to the east or northeast.

c. Conclusions: The VC will use harassing attacks, mines and booby traps to delay reconnaissance in force operations and avoid significant contact with US units in the area.

d. Weather and Terrain: During the operation, weather had no significant impact on military operations. Terrain hampered friendly movement and made maneuverability difficult. The trails cleared by the engineers throughout the area, alleviated the situation considerably, especially for mechanized and cavalry units.

(41) 161200 A/2-47 vic YS262865, to YS335875, report convoy received 1 RPG round and SA and AW fire from an unknown number of VC. C/2-47 was sent to the area and upon their arrival the VC broke contact and fled. There was 1 US WIA (slight); VC losses unknown.

(42) 161200 B/2-39 vic YS305820, guard sighted 1 VC. A patrol was dispatched and searched area without results.

(43) 161327 C/2-39 vic YS294839, destroyed 1 bunker and 1 booby trapped Chicom hand grenade.

(44) 161354 A/2-39 vic YS292839, found 11 bags of rice (1100 lbs), 2 RPG rounds, and misc documents. Rice was in an inaccessible location and upon contacting G2, the rice was destroyed and remainder evacuated to 2-39 CP.

(45) 170250 Recon/2-47 vic YS269871, spotted 3 VC approx 45 meters outside of perimeter. Engaged the VC with a claymore and patrol searched area without results.

(46) 170950 C/2-47 APC vic YS360844, hit 5 x 81mm mortar rounds rigged as pressure detonated land mines. Only 1 round detonated and there were no US casualties and no damage. The remaining rounds were destroyed in place.

(47) 171030 A/2-47 vic YS332844, found 12 old bunkers with old and caved in overhead cover. Bunkers were estimated 1 year old not recently used.

(48) 171130 A/2-39 vic YS313838, destroyed 1 bunker (4'x6'x4') with 2' overhead cover. Bunker was still being worked on.

(49) 171304 A/2-47 vic YS328837, found a VC base camp consisting of 10 bunkers (10'x7'), which appeared to be sleeping quarters and protection from artillery; the camp was used within the past week. In one bunker, found several 50 cal rounds without the powder, numerous "C" Ration cans, 3 anti-personnel mines, 500' wire, 1 Chicom claymore, and 100 rounds M-16 ammo. All were destroyed. At coordinates YS325834, found 49 bunkers of which 2 were (25'x15'x15'), 4 kitchens with assorted pots and pans, and 11 expended AK-47 rounds. All were destroyed.

f. Conclusions: Pre-intelligence reports were substantiated by various contacts with the enemy. The two base camps uncovered attested to the fact that the area was used by the VC as an important focal point for their activity. Most probably the area is a coordinating point for logistical operations and troop movements to other areas (RSSZ and Phuoc Tuy Province). This is verified by the construction of the bunkers. The bunkers generally had no firing ports and were very well protected against artillery or airstrikes. The VC also did not engage superior Allied Forces but rather dispersed throughout the area and escaped. The attack on B/2-39 on 12 Jan 68 was probably a rear action to cover the withdrawal of the VC units to the west and north, and then north to the northern part of Long Thanh District, across Hwy 1 and into the Cong Thanh District. The action disrupted the VC operations in the area, and especially their ability to launch offensive operations in that area. The VC need space and time to effectively operate. To interfere with either one is to severely limit their activity. The VC will probably return to this area but periodic Allied Offensive efforts will keep them off balance.

9. Mission: The 1st Bde, in close coordination and cooperation with 1st ATF, attacks at 111200H Jan 68 to locate and destroy elements of the 274th VC Main Force Regiment operating in the eastern portion of AO AKRON.

10. Concept of Operation:

(a) During the period 11-21 Jan 68, the 1st Brigade conducts Operation AKRON V in four phases.

(b) Maneuver:

(1) Phase I - TF 2-39 and TF 2-47 (M) move by air and motor march during the morning of 11 January 68 to assembly areas vic LD in central AO AKRON. TF 2-47 (M) establishes a screening/blocking position along Engineer trail with team 3-5 Cav in eastern AO AKRON on Engineer trail NLT 111200H January 68.

(2) Phase II - At 111200H, TF's 2-47 (M) and 2-39 conduct reconnaissance in force to the east through the morning of 13 January 1968 to locate and destroy elements of the 274th VC Main Force Regiment and other unidentified VC/NVA elements, to sweep objectives to the east in zone and to drive fleeing VC/NVA elements against blocking positions established by 1st ATF and team 3-5 Cav.

(3) Phase III - During the morning of 18 January, the 2-39 Inf is AML extracted and reinserted at Binh Son Airstrip. The Bn conducts reconnaissance in force through the morning of 21 Jan to the southeast to locate and destroy unidentified VC/NVA elements, working toward a blocking position established along the Engr Trail by TF 2-47 Inf (M).

(4) Phase IV - TF 2-47 (M) moves by motor march to AO FINGERS (northeast corner of AO DENVER) for further reconnaissance in force operations. TF 2-39 is AML extracted from Engr Trail and reinserted in AO FINGERS for further reconnaissance in force operations.

There were ten protective underground positions, 8'x6'x6' long; 15 each one man spider holes; there were fresh foot prints in the area. In the area, Recon Platoon captured 5 pair of VC black pajama type uniforms and 5 VC ponchos. At 1448H Recon Plat detained two RVN nationals vic YS273866; the detainees were interrogated and released. At 0755H, a UH1D, while landing at FSB HAMMER, received small arms fire and automatic weapons fire vic YS272823; there were negative US casualties and negative US equipment damage. At 1330H, an OH-23 received several rounds small arms fire southwest of FSB HAMMER, resulting in a damaged cockpit. At 1255H, TF 2-47th Inf (M) resupply convoy received 6 rounds of RPG fire and an estimated 18 rounds of small arms fire vic YS257-863. There were negative US casualties and negative US equipment damage.

14 Jan: TF 2-39th Infantry continued to exploit the area of contact on 13 January by searching and destroying within the VC base camp area located vic YS287837. The VC base camp area was linear in design and contained 55 protective bunkers connected by a defensive type trench system. The bunkers were constructed eight feet long, six feet wide, and five feet deep with an average of two and one half feet of overhead cover. The bunkers were estimated to have been built for six months, however, there

11 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf conducted airmobile assaults on LZ SCREW-DRIVER vic YS223834 with A Company and B Company commencing 110658H. BN. HQ, Co E, A Btry 1-11th Arty, and Co B 2-47th Inf (M) conducted motor march from Camp Martin Cox along RVN Route #15 to FSB GREEN vic YS225804 displacing to and closing FSB NAILS vic YS275804 at 1400H. Co A, upon securing LZ SCREWDRIVER, conducted S&D opns, north and became OPCON to 2-47th Inf (M). Co B, upon insertion at LZ SCREWDRIVER, conducted S&D opns east at 1209H. Co B engaged 12 VC at YS280837 with SA and AW fire; there were 1 US WIA (dusted off at 1350H) and negative VC casualties. Co B, at 1437H, discovered and destroyed one VC bunker 1½ meters deep x 2 meters long x 1 meter wide located vic YS178836. Co B, at 2133H vic YS282838, came under mortar attack; 2210H received ground attack from all directions with heaviest attack coming from NE; mortar attack also continuing; 2330H elements report VC massing fires from NE. US casualties and VC casualties unknown as of 2330H. Co B supported by LFT, Arty and USAF Dragon Ships. Co B engaged an estimated force of 6 VC at 1605H located vic YS238240; there were two US WIA (one dusted off at 1731H) and negative VC casualties. Co C, upon securing LZ SAW, conducted S&D opns northeast with negative contact. Co E and Co B 2-47th Inf (M) secured FSB NAILS; upon entering FSB NAILS at 1105H, the element received one round of RPG fire from an unknown size VC force. The VC were engaged with SA and AW fire; there were negative US or VC casualties. Co B 2-47th Inf (M), at 1300H, found and destroyed one VC mine consisting of 5 each 82mm HE mortar rounds vic YS297817. TF 2-47th Inf (M) conducted motor march from Camp Martin Cox along RVN Route #15 to FSB GREEN vic YS-200835 commencing 110516H with BN HQ, Co A (-), Co C and B Battery 1-11th Arty. Upon securing FSB GREEN, the BN conducted S&D opn east to FSB HAMMER located vic YS267872. Co A discovered and destroyed 1 mine with dual Detonation System (com and pressure) at 0855H vic YS240854. Co A also detonated a mine consisting of 4 each 82mm HE rds by running over it with a M113 APC at 0905H vic YS280846; there were negative US casualties and negative damage to the APC. Co B OPCON to TF 2-39th Inf. Co C at 1250H, found and destroyed a VC mine consisting of 3 each 82mm HE mortar rounds Vic YS297817, secured and patrolled vic FSB HAMMER. Co A (-) 4-39th Inf conducted an airmobile assault into LZ PLIERS vic YS341871 and became OPCON to A/3-5th Cav. A/3-5th Cav conducted motor march from Xuan Loc to vic LZ PLIERS; secured LZ PLIERS; assumed OPCON Co A (-) 4-39th Inf; screened in zone and became OPCON to TF 2-47th Inf (M). Scout Platoon secured 2-47th Inf HQ with negative VC contact.

12 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf continued search and destroy operations in zone with Co B and Co C; regained OPCON of Co A 2-39th Inf from TF 2-47th Inf (M); conducted an airmobile assault into LZ SCREWDRIVER (YS223834) with Co B 2-47th Inf (M); and secured FSB NAIL with Co E. Co A 2-39th Inf conducted search and destroy opn south from their RON position commencing 0730H to link up with Co B 2-39th Inf at YS282838. At 1425H, Co A engaged three VC vic YS284842 resulting in negative US casualties and two VC KIA (body count), one AK-47 rifle and one M79 grenade launcher. Co B 2-39th Inf (NOTE: Continued from 1st Bde SITREP Period 110001H-112400H Jan 68) reported that VC had broken contact at 0010H. At 0248H, VC commenced second attack against Co B, breaking contact at 0610H. Co B sustained 46 US WIA (31 dusted off) and negative US KIA. There were negative VC casualties. Co C conducted search and destroy opns north to link up with Co B 2-39th Inf vic YS222838. At 1645H, Co C found 300 lbs of rice vic YS279837. Co B 2-47th Inf (M) conducted airmobile assault on LZ SCREWDRIVER and conducted search and destroy operations east to link up with Co B 2-39th Inf. At 0900H Co B discovered a VC base camp with 55 bunkers vic YS279837 and captured 12 mortar rounds, 12 hand grenades, and 1000 lbs of rice. Aero Scts D/3-5th Cav, while supporting TF 2-39th Inf engaged 3 VC at 1435H vic YS2915 resulting in 1 VC KIA (BC).

was evidence of recent repair and construction. During the search of the base camp area there was a total of 14 VC KIA found in graves and 2 VC KIA found hanging in trees. The following are items of VC equipment found in the base camp: one combat serviceable 60mm mortar, 3,000 rounds of 7.62mm ammunition, 3,200 lbs of rice, 4 lbs of salt, 5 lbs dried shrimp, 5 gal soy-bean oil, 1 package of medicine, 5 lbs of documents, 4 RPG rounds, 2 RPG launchers, 25 Chicom grenades, 4 AK-47 magazines, 28 US 82mm mortar rounds, 67 60mm mortar fuses, 5 RPG propellant charges, 1 TA312 telephone, 1 US type claymore mine, and 3 pick mallets. All elements reported finding evidence of a hasty withdrawal of the VC forces. There were numerous articles of bloody clothing found in the base camp area and several improvised stretchers containing blood stains. A thorough debriefing of unit commanders and element leaders determined through eye witness reports that a minimum of 31 VC were killed or wounded during the contact within the VC base camp area. Companies A, B, and C 2-39th Inf and Co B 2-47th Inf (M) remained over night vic YS-289840. Co E continued to secure TF 2-39th Inf CP/FSB NAILS. TF 2-39th Inf was supported with one airstrike vic YS297836 resulting in 4 VC bunkers destroyed, 20 meters of trench destroyed, and 10 VC bunkers damaged. Resupply of the elements operating within the VC base camp area was accomplished by the 1st Bde Aviation section utilizing two OH-23 helicopters. Due to the dense jungle area and time factor only an LZ large enough to land an OH-23 could be cleared. The 1st Bde Aviation Section flew 154 sorties in 14 hours carrying 79 passengers and 33,300 lbs of equipment and supplies. The OH-23 carried in supplies and passengers and back-hauled captured VC equipment and supplies. TF 2-47th Inf (M) conducted search and destroy operations southwest along the ridge line (vic YS306857 to vic YS295845). Co A swept south to vic YS300347 with negative VC contact. A troop 3-5th Cav swept southwest to vic YS307850 receiving sniper fire at 1145H from an unknown size VC force vic YS378867; the element returned fire resulting in negative US casualties and unknown VC casualties. Co A (-) 4-39th Inf continued to maintain screening/blocking positions along the Engr Trail on the northern boundary of the AO. At 1145H an element of A troop escorting the AVLB to a crossing site vic YS346877 received an RPG, small arms and automatic weapons fire; the element returned fire resulting in two US WIA (2 dusted off) and one M113 destroyed. VC casualties were unknown. At 1525H, A troop reported finding a partially destroyed and unserviceable Mauser Rifle Model 92 vic YS-327877. Recon Platoon 2-47th Inf (M) continued to secure TF 2-47th CP/FSB HAMMER, provided security for resupply convoy, and supported by Engr squad, returned and destroyed 10 bunkers discovered on 13 Jan, vic YS271849.

15 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf continued Opn AKRON V. The TF continued to explore and destroy the large bunker complex discovered vic YS287837 and conducted search and destroy ops in zone. Co A and Co C continued to search and destroy vic of the VC base camp area. There were an additional 45 bunkers found in the area for an accumulative total of 100 bunkers found and searched in the base camp area. The following VC equipment and supplies were discovered: 1 RPG launcher, 2 hand grenades, 6 82mm mortar rounds, 339 rounds of AK-47 small arms, 600 lbs of rice, 100 lbs of medical supplies, 2 lbs of documents. There were also several blood trails and 5 VC KIA (body count) were found. The VC had been killed by small arms fire and were discovered unburied. At 1210H, Co C received small arms fire from an unknown size VC force; fire was returned and the VC broke contact by throwing a hand grenade resulting in one US slightly wounded and one VC KIA (body count). At 1546H, Co C discovered 3 graves vic YS301848 containing 3 VC killed by shrapnel. One VC appeared killed within last 12 hours; other bodies appeared two weeks old. At 1605H, the fourth platoon of Co C engaged one VC near the base camp area with small arms fire, resulting in negative US casualties and unknown VC casualties. Co B 2-47th Inf (M) and Co B 2-39th Inf conducted southwest toward FSB NAILS. At 1055H, Co B 2-47th Inf (M) discovered and destroyed one VC improvised mine consisting of two 105mm HE rounds and two 4.2 HE mortar rounds. At 1334H, Co B 2-47th Inf (M) found four VC bodies stripped of equipment near vic YS292832. The VC had been KIA

by artillery. TF 2-39th Inf was supported by four preplanned airstrikes; during one airstrike at 0930H vic YS290850, the fighters received ground fire from an unknown size VC force, resulting in negative US casualties and unknown VC casualties. At 1655H, a UH1D (Jayhawk 764) received small arms fire and force landed vic YS284840 resulting in negative US casualties. The crew was extracted at 1727H. Commencing at 1820H, an element from Co B 2-39th Inf was airmobiled from FSB NAILS to vic of downed UH1D to provide security. The UH1D was extracted by a CH-47 at 1845H. Co B commenced airmobile extraction at 1908H and the last sortie landed at FSB NAILS at 1933H. The extraction mission was accomplished without incident. TF 2-37th Inf (M) continued search and destroy operations east in zone. Co C and Co A 2-47th Inf (M) conducted S&D ops east to vic YS335870. At 1050H, Co A discovered 3 VC tunnels vic YS334871; the tunnels were caved in and there was negative signs of recent VC activity. Co B 2-47th Inf (M) remained OFCON to TF 2-39th Inf. At 0859H, Co A (-) 4-39th Inf commenced airmobile extraction from PZ PLIERS YS332874; at 0959H the last sortie departed PZ PLIERS; and Co A (-) returned to the control of TF 4-39th Inf (OPN RILEY) at Camp Martin Cox. Troop A 3-5th Cav was released OFCON from TF 2-47th Inf (M) at 1300H and conducted motor march to Camp Blackhorse. TF 2-47th Inf (M) reported that a UH1D received 15 rounds small arms fire while landing at FSB HAMMER; fire was returned with 50 cal machine gun and mortar fire. There were negative US casualties or equipment damage. Recon Platoon 2-47th Inf (M) sighted 1 VC at 1400H vic YS268873. The VC was pursued for several hundred meters with negative results.

16 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf completed searching the bunker complex and continued search and destroy operations in zone. Co A assisted by Co C completed the search of the bunker area and swept east from the bunker complex commencing at 1215H. Co A discovered a cache of 1,100 lbs of rice, two RFG rounds and one lb of documents at 1354H vic YS292839. It was necessary to destroy the rice cache because the thick triple canopy jungle prevented cutting of a LZ and the area to which the rice would have to be carried for evacuation would have prevented the element from accomplishing a thorough sweep of their objective area. Co B 2-39th Inf conducted a sweep north of FSB NAILS and returned to remain over night. Co C assisted Co A in the complete search of the base camp area and then swept east to remain over night with Co A vic YS303835. Co C reported finding one VC booby trapped chicom grenade and one VC bunker at 1317H vic YS293839. The bunker and grenade were destroyed. Co B 2-47th Inf (M) (OFCON to TF 2-39) conducted S&D operations northeast from FSB NAILS to vic YS317830 and returned to FSB NAILS to remain over night. At 1155H an outpost from Co B spotted 2 VC and engaged them with small arms fire vic YS305820. The outpost pursued the VC for several hundred meters resulting in negative US casualties and VC casualties unknown. Co E continued to secure FSB NAILS. TF 2-47th Inf (M) conducted S&D ops to the south with Co A and Co C to vic of LZ FILE YS287810. Co A commenced its sweeping operation south at 0902H. At 1128H, vic YS335875, Co A was unsuccessfully attacked by a VC ambush. The ambush was initiated by the VC firing an RFG at the rear of the lead M113 APC. The RFG missed the M113, exploded and caused only minor dents and scratches to the rear of the M113. Fire was returned by Co A and Co C moved from vic LZ PLIERS to reinforce Co A. Enroute Co C also received RFG and small arms fire. Co C arrived at the ambush site at 1131H, engaging the VC with small arms, automatic weapons and 50 cal machine gun fire causing the VC to break contact and flee to the west. The results of the contact were 2 US slightly wounded (treated by medic and released) and VC casualties were unknown. At 1407H, Co A found and destroyed 3 105mm Arty rounds. At 1125, TF 2-47th Inf (M) resupply convoy enroute to FSB HAMMER and escorted by Recon platoon (-), received small arms fire vic YS262865; fire was returned and the VC broke contact. There were negative US casualties; VC casualties were unknown. At 1045H, a patrol from Recon platoon made contact with 7 VC, engaging them with small arms fire vic YS270875. The VC broke contact and fled to the northeast. Artillery was fired into the area and at 1125H, Recon platoon (-) joined the patrol with combat tracker teams and

pursued the VC. Debriefing of the patrol concluded that there were two VC seen hit by small arms fire, however, a search of the area revealed only blood trails.

17 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf continued to conduct search and destroy operations east in zone. Co A followed by Co C (RRF) conducted a sweep east from vic YS303835 to clear objective vic YS314836. At 1145H, Co A found and destroyed one bunker vic YS313833 and at 1327H vic YS315837 destroyed 3 bunkers. Co A and Co C remained over night vic YS312822. Co B conducted search and destroy operations northeast of FSB NAILS to vic YS294827 and returned to FSB NAILS with negative VC contact and remained over night. Co E continued to provide security for FSB NAILS. Co B 2-47th Inf (M) (OPCON to TF 2-39th Inf) conducted search and destroy operations northeast to vic YS294827 and returned to FSB NAILS with negative VC contact and remained over night. TF 2-47th Inf (M) continued to conduct search and destroy operations west and southwest in zone. Co A and Co C conducted search and destroy opns southwest from their night location to vic YS325884 at 0955H. Co C's point M113 hit an improvized 81mm mortar HE pressure detonated mine vic YS338845. There were negative casualties or equipment damage. At 1020H Co A found and destroyed three VC bunkers vic YS328844. At 1145H, Co A found and destroyed a VC base camp containing 10 bunkers vic YS328837. Also found in the VC base camp were expended 50 cal brass, C-ration cans, three anti-personnel mines, a Chicom claymore mine, and 100 rounds of 5.56 M16 small arms ammo. At 1430H, Co C discovered a VC base camp containing 49 bunkers vic YS325834, ten were new and the others old and unserviceable. The ten new bunkers were destroyed. The following equipment and supplies were found in the base camp area: 3 kitchens with pots and pans; 1 expended round of AK-47 ammo and 10 rounds of unexpended AK-47 small arms ammo. At 1530H a patrol from Recon platoon made contact with an unknown size VC force in a VC base camp located vic YS268882. In the ensuing fire fight the patrol sustained one KIA, one WIA dusted off, and three WIA with minor wounds (treated and returned to duty). Artillery fire and an immediate air strike were placed on the base camp resulting in 10 bunkers destroyed, 12 bunkers damaged and two hundred meters of trench destroyed.

18 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf initiated Phase III of Opn AKRON V by conducting an airmobile assault on the BINH SON air strip (YS429916) and conducted search and destroy opns south in zone. Co A spear-headed the assault, lifting off from LZ vic YS312822 at 0804H, followed by Co B 2-39th Inf and Co C. Co C completed the airmobile assault at 1140H. Upon securing the LZ, Co A, Co B and Co C with Recon platoon attached swept south in zone and established a three company night location vic YS247907. Co B, 2-47th Inf (M) secured the PZ for Co A, Co B and Co C; provided security for the motor movement of TF 2-39th Inf (-) from FSB NAILS to FSB GREY (YS212937). Co B was returned to the control of TF 2-47th Inf (M) at 1340H. Upon being released from OPCON TF 2-39th Inf, Co B established a night location at LONG THANH (YS138921) and provided one platoon security force for the 8 inch Arty Battery located vic YS137918. Co B assumed the mission of rapid reaction force for the defense of LONG THANH RF/PP outpost. TF 2-47th Inf (M) initiated phase III OPN AKRON V establishing blocking positions along the Engineer Trail from vic YS260860 to YS290888. Co A and Co C departed their night location at 0817H. Co A established blocking positions west of FSB HAMMER, screened and conducted roadrunner opns in zone. Co C established blocking positions along the Engineer trail vic YS290890 west to vic YS282-885. At 1200H, Co C reported receiving 5 to 6 rounds of semi-automatic small arms fire from a sniper vic YS290890. Co C returned fire with small arms, automatic weapons and 81mm mortar. There were negative US casualties and VC casualties were unknown. At 1825H, Co C engaged one VC vic YS275885, with M79 and small arms fire resulting in negative US casualties; VC casualties were unknown. Recon platoon, TF 2-47th Inf (M) conducted local patrols north of FSB HAMMER and provided convoy security between Hwy 15 and FSB HAMMER. Co A and Co C remained overnight in their blocking positions. At 1305H, vic FSB HAMMER an OH-23 received 2 rounds of small arms fire. There were negative equipment damage or casualties.

19 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf continued OPN AKRON V, Phase III conducting search and destroy opns south in zone with Co A, Co B and Co C with Recon platoon attached. At 1227H, Co C made contact with an estimated 4-5 VC vic YS260904. Co A engaged the VC with small arms, automatic weapons, and was supported by artillery. There was one KIA and one US WIA (MEDDEVAC); VC casualties were unknown. At 1320H, Co A found and destroyed five VC bunkers vic YS260904. Co C found and destroyed ten bunkers vic YS248902. Co C found and destroyed ten bunkers vic YS248902, and discovered the following items of equipment: 1 pair of US Army boots, small arms ammo, medical supplies, women's clothing and a small amount of documents. TF 2-39th Inf Headquarters and CP remained at FSB GREY (BINH SON). TF 2-47th Inf (M) continued Phase III, OPN AKRON V blocking in zone with Co A and Co C, maintained Co B at Long Thanh (YS138918) as a rapid reaction force to assist in the defense of RF/FF outposts vic Long Thanh; Recon platoon patroled locally vic FSB HAMMER, and provided roadrunners and convoy security between RVN route 15 and FSB HAMMER. At 0912H, Co A found and destroyed a VC position containing 8 bunkers without overhead cover. Co C found and destroyed 5 bunkers vic YS282894 at 1442H.

20 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf continued OPN AKRON V, Phase III conducting search and destroy opns south in zone with Companies A, B & C. At 0855H, Co A engaged an unknown size VC force with small arms and automatic weapons fire vic YS262892. Co A was supported by artillery fire and an airstrike. There were two US WIA and VC casualties were unknown. Co C received automatic weapons fire (AK-47) and carbine fire at 1356H from an estimated force of seven VC. Co C returned fire immediately with small arms and automatic weapons fire causing the VC to flee the area, artillery was placed to block the escape route of the VC, however a sweep of the area revealed only blood trails and one VC structure which Co C destroyed. TF 2-39th Inf completed their sweep at 1658H and moved through TF 2-47th Inf (M) blocking positions and remained overnight at vic YS277890. TF 2-47th Inf (M) continued to screen and block in zone with Co A and Recon Platoon. Co B remained at Long Thanh (YS138918) providing a rapid reaction force for the defense of RF/FF outposts in the vic of Long Thanh. Co B released one platoon to OPCON 199th Light Infantry Brigade at 1600H. Co C was released OICON to TF 4-39th Inf at 1005H.

21 Jan: TF 2-39th Inf completed OPN AKRON V with the airmobile extraction from AO AKRON. Co A, Co B and Co C were extracted from PZ vic YS277890 utilizing one airmobile helicopter company. The extraction commenced at 0816H and terminated at 1048H. Bn Hq was extracted from FSB GREY commencing at 1110H using CH-47 helicopters and was completed at 1250H. Co E was extracted from a PZ vic YS277890 commencing at 1300H utilizing CH-47 helicopters and terminating at 1505H. TF 2-47th Inf (M) completed OPN AKRON V conducting a motorized withdrawal from AO AKRON with the Bn Hq and Co A commencing at 0845H. Recon platoon secured the PZ for TF 2-39th Inf and withdrew upon the completed extraction. The last element of TF 2-47th Inf (M) cleared AO AKRON at 1400H.

Units remained on a ration cycle C-C-C for most of the operation without noted discrepancies.

(2) Class II and IV:

(a) Class II requisitions were handled by the rear detachments who maintained radio communications with forward locations.

(b) All other items of an urgent nature were flown directly to requesting unit on as needed basis by rear detachment personnel.

f. Services

(1) Unit water trailers were slung airlifted and extracted on a daily basis by CH47.

(2) Metal and plastic 5 gallon containers were utilized during the operation.

(3) Non-potable water sources in forward areas were purified on an individual basis by the use of iodine/chlorine tablets.

g. Graves Registration: GR support was provided by the 9th S&T Battalion located at Bearcat.

14. Civic Actions/Psychological Operations: There were no civic action projects conducted that were directly related to Operation AKRON V. During Operation AKRON V, the PSYOP Team, through coordination with S-2 and S-3, flew both loudspeaker and leaflet missions in support of the operation. A first was introduced during the operation. This was the use of 105 artillery shells filled with leaflets. There was a total of 667,600 leaflets disseminated during the operation. Of these, 24,000 were dispersed by means of the 105mm artillery rounds. The themes of the leaflets were: Chieu Hoi Mixture, Chieu Hoi Questions, Scare and Power, Allied Power, Safe Conduct Passes and assorted TET leaflets. There were also two special leaflets developed and printed especially for use against the 274th VC Regiment. The loudspeaker unit of the U-10 aircraft was utilized for a total time of four (4) hours and five minutes. The themes of the tapes were taken from the JUSPAO produced stock. These themes fitted well with the situations encountered. However, the team produced one tape in response to intelligence reports of a resupply effort through the village of Bn Ky. The greatest discovery of the operation, in a PSYOP point of view, was the use of 105mm artillery shells. This gives the timely delivery of propaganda on a particular unit, while they are still in contact with our forces. The only drawback to the shells is that they are prepacked with standard Chieu Hoi Leaflets and Safe Conduct Passes. Special situations still require the use of an aircraft. In a number of instances

the aerial dissemination immediately preceded either an air strike or an artillery barrage. Although not planned, the psychological advantages are tremendous. The leaflets are no sooner on the ground than the attack is upon them. This brings a real sense of credibility to all our propaganda.

15. Commander's Evaluation: Operation AKRON V succeeded in locating and destroying elements of the 274th VC Main Force Regiment as prescribed in the original mission. The absence of the FIRST BRIGADE in AO RILEY, and specifically AO AKRON, during the Operation SANTA FE allowed the VC/NVA elements to improve fortifications, stockpile supplies and move about freely. Troop D, 3-5th Cav performed admirably in their overwatch mission (Operation AKRON IV) and gathered valuable intelligence, but they did not possess the ground troops to curtail VC movements and operations. It was evident from pre-operational intelligence that AO AKRON had been used as a refuge and way station on a major north-south supply route. This route lead from the RUNG SAT Special Zone northeast across Hwy 15 through the HAT DICH area and north across Hwy 1 into War Zone D and it was active during November and December. Movements were also traced east from the HAT DICH area to the MAY TAO Secret Zone. The airmobile and ground assaults of the 2-39th Inf and the 2-47th Inf (M) respectively, and the sweep east toward the 1st ATF/3-5th Cav block, trapped several elements of the 274th Regt. This was verified by the moderately heavy contacts and enemy delaying actions encountered in base camp locations. The contacts succeeded in fragmenting the VC/NVA elements, eliminating several of their coveted base locations, and sharply deterred their plans. The major contributing factors that allowed 1st Brigade elements to close with the enemy were the surprise achieved by the insertion on LZ SCREWDRIVER of an Infantry battalion without preparatory fires and the deliberate late positioning of forces, especially artillery. Should this operation or one of similar characteristics be conducted again a few adjustments could be warranted. With the same number of maneuver elements available it might be advisable to sweep and block a smaller area. Greater concentration would undoubtedly increase the degree of success achieved on this type of operation. Combining Infantry, both US and Australian, Armored Cavalry and Mechanized Infantry, with cross attachments wherever practical, proved to be tactically effective and feasible. Rapport with the 1st ATF was reinforced by close cooperation and coordination during both planning and execution phases. Operation AKRON V contributed much to the further welding of FWMAF. The forces participating in Operation AKRON V did much to accelerate the neutralization of the HAT DICH area as a VC haven.
