NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December, Company "A" remained at Da Nang under OPCON of the 7th Engineer Battalion. The Battalion (-) and a platoon from the 1st Bridge Company which is in direct support of Task Force X-Ray and billeted with this Battalion remained at Chu Lai. The latter Companies continued to maintain 20 km of Route # 1, 2.5 km of Route # 22, the interior road net of FISB-B, and the CLDC ASP site. This expended 670.5 man days and 3000 equipment hours, using 600 cu yds of sand, 186 cu yds of 3/4" gravel, 200 cu yds of fill dirt, 2235 cu yds of road rock and 120' of 24" culvert. The quarry operation produced 3220 cu yds of road rock and 1425 cu yds of 3/4" gravel expending 300 equipment hours on the two rock crushers. Work was hampered by continuous heavy rains which increased the road maintenance. A continuous road and bridge reconnaissance of Route # 1 was carried on for the Task Force X-Ray Engineer within the TAOR. On 5 December 1966 a Food and Bridge Reconnaissance was submitted to III MAF Engineer and the Task Force X-Ray Engineer covering Route # 1 from BT 378175 to BS 647773. A total of 1500 man hours and 825 equipment hours was expended in completing this project. During the first week of the month the bridge platoon constructed a 5 float reinforced raft ferry at BT 379174. On 5 December the VC blew a 30' bridge at BT 568979 which was replaced with a 30' deck balk fixed span bridge. The Battalion continued to support the ROK Marines by maintaining 20 km of roads and operating a water point. The forms were set for the floor of the Dickey CHAPELLE Memorial Dispensary. Several dump loads of scrap lumber was distributed to the people of Tich Tay Hamlet thru the Civic Action Program. On 22 December a Christmas Party was held for the same Hamlet. Thirteen hundred pounds of clothing, medical supplies, food, candy, and toys, donated by the people of Waukegan, Illinois was distributed. On 28 December one platoon from Company "D" supported the CLDC in a small search operation with mine sweep teams and security forces. During the month the Battalion supplied CLDC with 2 mine sweep teams on 3 separate occasions and supplied 1 Staff NCO and 9 enlisted to the

Provisional Company in the CLDC. The 6 water points operated by the Battalion Utilities platoon processed 1,851,755 gal. of water. During the month 4 men left the Battalion on emergency leave. The Battalion joined 2 Officers and 95 enlisted and transferred 3 Officers and 25 enlisted.
