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## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of March 1968, the 9th Engineer Battalion, LtCol H. E. PEREA Commanding, continued as its primary mission the maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route # 1 from Chu Lai (BT 520044) to the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554). The maintenance of road networks for the Americal Division, Supply Company (Rein) FLSG-B, plus engineer support of free world forces in the Chu Lai TAOR continued to require a significant engineer effort.

Company "A" continued maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route # 1 between Chu Lai (BT 520044) and Tam Ky (BT 330209), a distance of 16 miles and engaged in vertical construction in support of the Americal Division.

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Company "B" was located near Hue, RVN (YD 730110).

Company "C" (-) was located at Hill # 10 (BT 199390) and was in the process of maintaining and upgrading RVN Route #1 from Hill # 29 (BT 226320) to Thang Binh (BT 175418), a distance of 11 miles. The 3rd Platoon, Company "C" was located on Hill # 29 and was in the process of upgrading and maintaining RVN Route #1 from Tam Ky (BT 300233) north to Hill # 29, a distance of 8.5 miles.

Company "D" continued maintenance and upgrading of RVN Route #1 from Thang Binh (BT 175418) to the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554), a distance of 11.1 miles. Company "D" was located at Hill # 63 (BT 132453).

During the month of March, upgrading and repair of RVN Route #1 was broken down into four areas of responsibility; Chu Lai to Tam Ky, Tam Ky to Hill # 29, Hill # 29 to Thang Binh, and Thang Binh to the Song Cau Lau.

Between Chu Lai (BT 520044) and Tam Ky (BT 330209) the 9th Engineer Battalion expended 2,423 man hours and 1,527 equipment hours in hauling and placing 6,955 cubic yards of rock.

Between Tam Ky (BT 300235) and Hill # 29 (BT 226320), the 9th Engineer Battalion personnel expended 781 man hours and 175 equipment hours in hauling and placing 1,355 cubic yards of rock and 630 cubic yards of fill.

Between Hill # 29 (BT 226320) and Thang Binh (BT 175418), the 9th Engineer Battalion personnel expended 828 man hours and 339 equipment hours in hauling and placing 1,600 cubic yards of rocks and 2,310 cubic yards of fill.

Between Thang Binh (BT 175418) and the Song Cau Lau (BT 091554), the 9th Engineer Battalion personnel expended 3,813 man hours and 3,277 equipment hours in hauling and placing 38 cubic yards of rock and 5,205 cubic yards of fill.

During the month of March, the 9th Engineer Battalion units replaced and/or repaired (15) culverts at (11) locations along RVN Route # 1. Replacement of these culverts, necessitated by enemy demolitions, required 328' of 60" culvert, 158' of 48" culvert, and 116' of 36" culvert as shown below:


