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II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May, Company "A" remained at Da Nang under OPCON of the 7th Engineer Battalion. Commencing 15 May 1967 Company "B" (-) Rein was sent to Phu Bai to provide engineer support in OPCON of III MAF. The Battalion (-) and 3rd Platoon, 1st Bridge Company, in direct support to the battalion, remained at Chu Lai. "D" Company continued to assume complete responsibility for maintaining and upgrading 25.76km of Route #22. The above mentioned work utilized 4530 man hours and 3070 equipment hours, using 4508 cubic yards of fill and 3399 cubic yards of rock. The following culverts were installed: 144 feet of 18 inch and 128 feet of 36 inch. The quarry operation produced 2687 cubic yards of rock. The Battalion continued to support the ROK Marines by maintaining 20 km of roads and a water point. This work utilized 1364 equipment hours and 7562 cubic yards of fill. There was 434,000 gallons of water produced for ROK. During May the six (6) other water points operated by the battalion produced a total of 2,513,224 gallons of water. A reinforced platoon was in direct support of the 5th Marines in Operation Union II for three (3) days. A demolition team was furnished to the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion for two (2) days. One (1) minesweep team was sent to support a 7th Motor Transport convoy. During the reporting period one (1) man left on emergency leave and one (1) man was accidentally shot by U. S. Army personnel at Duc Pho, one (1) man was injured when a TD-18 he was operating hit a mine and one (1) man was injured by a dropped culvert. During May the battalion joined one-hundred thirty-eight (138) enlisted men and three (3) officers, and transferred thirty-six (36) enlisted men. One officer was TID in Phu Bai for two days concerning engineer support. A Bronze Star was awarded to one (1) sergeant. The Battalion Reconnaissance Officer conducted bridge and road repair work in the N. Da Nang area. Also a helicopter reconnaissance was made on the Duc Pho - N. Da area. A combination tactical ferry was removed at coordinates BT 497066. The battalion completed a roadnet at BT 515054 and constructed a two (2) lane fair weather road from coordinates BT 240177 to BT 155185. A 5 float class 55 ferry was maintained by the battalion at coordinates BT 378174 and a 1250 square foot ammunition storage facility was completed. The battalion commenced construction on a complete cantonment for the Army 161st Combat Aviation Company. The following work was done in support of Task Force Oregon: commenced construction of a 100 foot by 100 foot helipad.

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pad at the POW compound, furnish a 125 CPM compressor and operator for construction of mortar positions in HHC billeting areas, and construct a 300 meter by 175 meter storage pad. The battalion also did the following work through Task Force Oregon for the 2nd Surgical Hospital: provide access and commence digging well at coordinates BT 528117, pour concrete sidewalk and extend pharmacy building 10 feet with a concrete deck, install plumbing and electrical fixtures in X-Ray building, construct water lines from water tower to operating and wash rooms, and construct one (1) quonset hut with concrete deck and sidewalls. The four (4) TD-18's and ten (10) operators in support of U. S. Army 39th Engineers returned to the battalion, while the two (2) 5kw floodlight units plus two (2) operators remained in their support.
