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#### II. NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of June, Company "A" remained at Da Nang under OPCON of 7th Engineer Battalion. On 23 June the first elements of Company "B" returned from Phu Bai, RVN where they had been providing engineer support to the Third Marine Division. By 24 June the entire company had returned to Chu Lai. The Battalion (-) and 3rd Platoon, 1st Bridge Company in direct support of the 9th Engineer Battalion, remained at Chu Lai. Company "D" retained responsibility for maintaining and upgrading Route #1 from the rock crusher site north to Tam Ky. Company "D" spent 12,022 man hours and 6487 equipment hours in placing 3107 cubic yards of fill and 3207 cubic yards of rock. Work included clearing and ditching operations, filling of the south approach to An Tan bridge, and the installation of 3 each 18" culverts 40' long. The quarry operation produced 3862 cubic yards of crushed rock. The Battalion continued to support the ROK Marines with a reinforced platoon from Company "C" which is responsible for maintaining 20 km of road and a water point. Work on the road required 5010 man hours, 1835 equipment hours and 4667 cubic yards of fill. The water point at the Korean Marine Corps Camp provided 275,000 gallons of water. During June the five (5) other water points operated by the Battalion produced

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4,919,800 gallons of water. A demolition team has been in support of the 1st Marine Reconnaissance Battalion since 28 June and another demolition team has been in support of 2/11 since 27 June. Also in the month of June the Battalion joined 81 enlisted men and 8 officers and transferred 190 enlisted men and 19 officers. One officer returned from ADM school on Okinawa. The Battalion Reconnaissance Officer made several road and bridge recons north to the Thang Binh area. On 9 June the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division visited the area and on 28 June the Commanding General, MFPac, Commanding General, III MAF and Commanding General, Chu Lai Installation Coordinator visited the 9th Engineer Battalion area. A 5 float class 55 ferry was maintained at coordinates BT 378174 and a 53' MAT6 fixed span bridge was placed and removed at coordinates BT 276262 for passage of a tank company moving north on Route #1. Work continued on the Dickie Chapelle Dispensary with the construction of a water purification shed, two thousand (2000) gallon septic tank and drain field, and a water tower. In addition the Battalion completed construction of a 25' x 50' storage shed at FLSC-B, a 60' x 200' storage pad at MAG-13, a 65' x 592' bomb storage pad at MAG-13, a 100' x 100' helopad at the Chu Lai POW compound and 11 huts at MAG-36. A water well is also being drilled for MAG-36. The Battalion began construction of two bunkers, 1 at 2nd LAAI Battalion and 1 at 1st Reconnaissance Battalion. The Battalion also continued to support Task Force Oregon by completing the following: dug three wells; utilities connections were made to three (3) house trailers; constructed a 30' x 50' storage building; a 100' x 100' helopad, and a generator shed for 4 - 100 kw generators; rewired four (4) surgical suites; applied pentaprime on several miles of roads; constructed 34 - 4 hole heads. The following projects are in progress: constructing addition to Task Force Oregon messhall; installing a new power distribution system at 2nd Surgical Hospital (USA); constructing a 20' x 40' tactical operations center bunker; building a complete cantonment for the 161st Aviation Company (USA) and one for the 14th Aviation Battalion (USA); constructing a helicopter landing pad 240' x 480'; and pouring a 25' x 32' concrete pad for two (2) computer vans.

English language classes for 11 adults and 19 children were given in the village of Tich Tay for a total of 13 hours.
