PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During July 1970, the 9th Engineer Battalion was under the command of Lieutenant Colonel John P. Kraynak. The Battalion continued to perform its primary missions of conducting minesweeps of Vietnam Route #1, from Hill #29 (BT243317), to the Ba Ren River (BT102510), and upgrading and paving Vietnam Route #1 from Tam Ky City to the Ba Ren River (BT102510). The Battalion continued to provide engineer support to the Free World Forces in the Americal Division, Korean and 1st Marine Division areas of operation. On 19 July 1970, the Battalion began a standdown to prepare for redeployment to COMUS. On that date the Battalion started a massive program to clean up all of the vehicles, equipment and tools for embarkation.
2. Company "B", located at Hill #10 (BT196386), continued to perform their primary mission of conducting deliberate and visual minesweeps and culvert checks from Hill 10 (BT196386), to Hill #29 (BT243317), a deliberate and visual minesweep and culvert check from Hill #10 (BT196386), to the Ly Ly River (BT145457), and the upgrade and maintenance of Vietnam Route #1 from Tam Ky (BT293240), to the Ly Ly River (BT145457). The company continued construction support to the Free World Forces in the Americal Division area of operations. On 19 July 1970, the company began a standdown and started cleaning vehicles, equipment and tools to prepare for redeployment. The two minesweeps from Hill 10 to Hill 29 and Hill 10 to the Ly Ly River were turned over to the Americal Division on 19 July 1970. On 25 July 1970, the company command post and one platoon moved into the Battalion compound in DaLang. A guard detachment will remain on Hill #10 until the compound is turned over to another unit.
3. Company "C", located in the Battalion compound in DaLang began a standdown on 1 July 1970, to clean vehicles and equipment for redeployment to COMUS, and departed DaLang on 10 July 1970, for Camp Pendleton, California.
4. Company "D", located at Landing Zone Baldy (BT136448), continued to perform their primary missions of conducting a visual minesweep and culvert check of Vietnam Route #1 between the Ly Ly River (BT145457), and the Ba Ren River (BT102510), and the hauling of base rock to Tam Ky City between BT330210 and BT293240 to prepare Vietnam Route #1 in the city for paving. The company continued to provide construction support to the Free World Forces in the 7th Marine Regiment and Korean areas of operation. On 19 July 1970, the company began a standdown to clean equipment, vehicles and tools for redeployment to COMUS. On 10 July 1970, the company completed the training of the RF Group minesweep team and turned over the minesweep of Vietnam Route #1 from the Ly Ly River (BT145457), and the Ba Ren River (BT102510), to them on that date.

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5. During the period from 1 thru 19 July 1970, the Battalion continued to perform its primary missions of providing haul support to the 3 NCB and upgrading of Vietnam Route #1 from Tam Ky to the Ly Ly River.

a. During the reporting period the following mineral products were placed on Vietnam Route #1 between Tam Ky and the Ly Ly River: 1,964 tons of asphaltic concrete, 6,372 tons of 2"(-), 194 tons of 3/4 inch aggregate and 99 cubic yards of sand for cement headwalls on the culverts, 33 cubic yards of ready mix concrete for headwalls.

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

Company A, 9th Engineer Battalion was deployed out of Republic of Vietnam on 2 March 1970; arriving and disembark Hawaii on 16 March 1970 becoming a increment of the 1st Marine Brigade.

While a unit in Vietnam it's headquarters was on Hill 10, south of Danang. The Company's primary mission was maintaining road QL 1 between Tam Ky and Thang Binh, RVN; in addition to mine field clearing, small bridge construction and bunker complex construction in and around various Marine Corps elements located south of Danang. After deployment from Vietnam and arrival on Hawaii the Company was faced with reorganization and rehabilitation of all its equipment. Personnel were needed to bring the unit to T/O strength.

e. Special Operations. No special operations or exercises have been conducted during the period covered.

f. Command relations. In the absence of a battalion headquarters this units immediate command is Brigade Headquarters.

g. Equipment. On reforming in March 1970 after deployment from the Republic of Vietnam, this Company was in C-4 Operational Category due to class I type II T/E deficiencies of 47% of the original T/E. Of this percentage 14 major end items were in code H category. In turn this unit has received 3 major end items for replacements.
