6/11 Stand Down Underway

Swimming in the ice blue surf of the South China Sea, USO shows, cold soda and beer and plenty of time for sleeping...these are some of the luxuries of the 6/11 stand down area in Chu Lai.

The Battalion started the stand down program in June to give the 6/11 Cannon Cockers a "chance" to get away from the rigors of combat. "Thus far 20 men have visited the stand down area. Most of them agree that it is a refreshing change.

Every Monday morning, two men from each of the five batteries go to the stand down area. Men are selected on the basis of "time in country" and performance of duty. The stand down personnel return to friendly Duc Pho the following Friday morning.

One of the biggest attractions at the stand down area is the new Division Artillery (DIVARTY) Craft Shop. Located a short distance from the stand down area, the shop offers slot car racing, leather craft, wood craft, plus the largest photo lab in the Division. Table tennis is also available.

Transportation is a small problem at the stand down area for the time being. But an industrious Soldier has little trouble "thumbing" from one end of Chu Lai to the other in just a few minutes.

The best description of the stand down area was made by one of the men who returned to Duc Pho last Friday. With a quiver in his voice and a tear in his eye, he said, "I thought I had died and gone to Heaven."

Service Numbers Replaced by SSAN

July is "BIG CHANGE" month for US Soldiers all over the world. To most of us the 12% pay increase is the most important change...but there are other changes which affect all of us.

Effective July 1st, your Social Security Number becomes your Service Number. New inductees into the Army, God bless them, will no longer be issued service numbers. Your Social Security Number will be used on all official paperwork and records and should be used in your mailing address.

If you DEROS after December 15th, 1969 you must have your Social Security Number placed on your ID Card. All ID Cards in need of correction should be changed no later than November 1st, 1969. Your Battery 1st Sergeant can give you all the information about having your ID Card corrected.
