TRAFFICKING IN DRUGS CAN WRECK YOUR TRIP

Australian courts recently sentenced two U.S. soldiers on R&R in Sidney to five years respectively, at hard labor. Their offense? Importing drugs into Australia. The two soldiers were not isolated cases. More and more authorities, not only in Australia, but all of the R&R sites are cracking down on the traffic in illegal drugs.

In Hong Kong, the maximum punishment for possession of drugs is \$2,000 U.S. dollars and three years in prison. This can be imposed on a soldier discovered with even a small amount of marijuana. Anyone caught with more than a small amount of drugs, may be charged with more serious offense of trafficking in drugs--importing drugs for the purpose of selling. The maximum punishment for this offense is \$10,000 U.S. dollars and three years imprisonment.

Yet, the soldiers charged with drugs violation in Hong Kong are relatively lucky when compared to soldiers charged in Tokyo.

In Hong Kong, soldiers usually have to wait a short time in jail before they are brought to trial.

BRAVO NETS ONE NVA

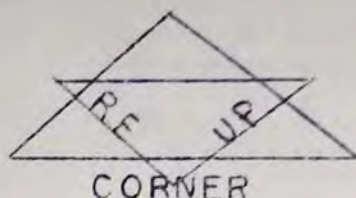
On January 18, foraging operations for the NVA got a set back when Bravo Company left a stay behind ambush in its old Night Defensive Position, located four miles southeast of San Juan Hill.

The stay behind ambush had been set and anxious moments passed while the men from Bravo Company's second platoon waited for the slightest sign that the enemy was nearing their position. Then, Private First Class David (cont. pg. 2 bot. col. 1)

In Tokyo, it is not uncommon for soldiers to spend up to three months in prison just waiting for their cases to come to trial.

It is important to remember that all the time a soldier spends in jail as the result of a conviction is considered bad time by the Army.

When a soldier gets out of prison he will have his DEROS and ETS extended by the Army and he may receive an undesirable discharge. Also, any soldier convicted of a drug offense has his name recorded with the U.S. Bureau of Narcotics. (cont. pg. 2, col. 1)

If a soldier is detected bringing marijuana into Hawaii, he is immediately returned to Vietnam for court martial. He can be tried for possession, sale, use or introduction, depending on the circumstances of the case.

The maximum sentence a soldier can receive from a court martial for a marijuana offense is five years imprisonment, total forfeitures, reduction in grade to E-1 and a dishonorable discharge. For co-called hard narcotics, the prison term can be up to ten years.

At the very least, a soldier may receive a fine if convicted. However, his R&R will be ruined, and he will be shipped back to Vietnam immediately after the trial.

D. Crabtree (Fresno, California, Private First Class Stephen L. Busby (Olympia, Washington), and Private First Class Scott F. Shelagowski (Glenwood, Michigan), who were concealed behind the mortar pit berm, heard the unmistakable sound of tin cans rattling "those cans made a good early warning system, they let us know the NVA were coming before we could see them."

Tension built up as the men waited for some clue as to what had caused the noise. Then they saw two NVA come out of the heavily wooded ravine and carefully picked their way up the hill. "We waited until they got closer and then we could see that both had weapons. The NVA in the lead looked up and spotted the ambush," said Sergeant Charles Page (Mount Vernon, Ohio).

With quick agreement the men of the second platoon opened up with small arms fire, downing one NVA. The second NVA immediately made a hasty retreat down the ravine. Fearing that the NVA would get away, PFC Busby, reacting instantaneously, gave chase to the evading NVA. As he reached the side of the downed NVA the wounded enemy soldier reached for his weapon. "We opened up immediately and when the firing ceased one NVA lay dead," said Sergeant Page.

The ambush netted Bravo Company one NVA killed and one bolt action rifle confiscated.

BATTALION SUMMARY

10 January

Bravo Company found a bunker complex with seventeen bunkers and one hut during search and clear operations three clicks southeast of San Juan.

R&R: HAWAIIAN STYLE

Hawaii has special appeal for those personnel who are married or who desire to meet friends or family from the mainland. The Hawaiian Islands, and Oahu in particular, have tremendous tourist facilities and everything seems oriented towards the entertainment and pleasure of visitors. The Waikiki Beach area is where most tourists made accommodations at the several large and luxurious hotels. Also, at Waikiki is the largest concentration of nightclubs and a myriad of restaurants with foods from all over the world.

If someone is to meet you in Hawaii, it is advised that they make hotel reservations in advance. The hotels are frequently filled to capacity and you will save valuable time by having a room waiting for you. If you do arrive without reservation, the R&R Center at Fort DeRussy has a reservation service which includes most all hotels on Waikiki Beach. Here you can quickly find out what rooms are available and in what price range they fall.

The Hawaiian Islands are characterized by beautiful beaches, tropical flowers, hula dancers and a quality of romance unlike any other state of the Union. The people are a mixture of Polynesian, Chinese, Japanese, and Maola which is the Hawaiian name for those who came from the mainland. The Polynesian - Oriental strain is distinguished by graciousness and courteous manners. These people are very much a part of modern America yet have maintained the ease of their ancestors. Because of this one feels at home almost immediately in Hawaii.

For sightseeing, most R&R personnel prefer to rent a car; the main reason being the reduced rates which are offered. Interesting places to see with a car are Palo Lookout which gives a panoramic view of Honolulu and Waikiki; Round Top Drive, a curving mountain road above Waikiki, with beautiful homes perched on its heights; and The Diamond Head area which extends along the shore east of Waikiki. If you would like to see the memorial to the battleship Arizona, it is a short drive past Honolulu to Pearl Harbor. Enjoyable yacht cruises are available for a tour of the harbor and the memorial. You may also wish to drive around the entire island and through the pineapple fields for a free sample of Hawaii's most famous product. Other frequented attractions, all close to Honolulu, are the Iolani Palace, Ala Moana Park, The International Market Place and the Hawaiian Cultural Arts Center.

Water sports are, of course, very popular and good facilities are available. Surfboarding and water skiing lessons are easy to obtain. Hickam Air Force Base will loan qualified personnel small sailboats. The Glass Bottom Boat is unique for it gives a direct view of the coral and fish without even getting wet.

For good eating one can't go wrong at the top hotels. One skyscraper hotel has a revolving restaurant for its uppermost level. The Lau Yee (Cont. on pg. 4, col. 2)

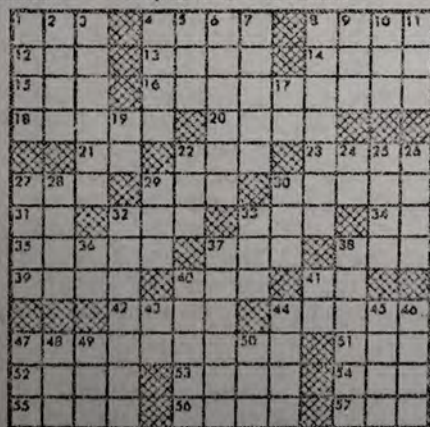
