AMERICAL DIVISION NEWS

CHU LAI (AMERICAL IO)--Light action prevailed in southern I Corps yesterday, with Americal Division units reporting 15 VC killed, six enemy suspects detained, and four weapons captured.

FREDERICK HILL--The 196th Inf. Bde. reported four VC killed and three weapons captured.

PFC Joseph Rodriguez (Puerto Rico), the point man of a patrol from Co. D, 3-21 Inf. spotted two VC among hootches in front of him and engaged them killing one, detaining a wounded suspect, and capturing an SKS rifle 14½ miles northwest of Tam Ky.

"Blue Ghost" gunships of F Trp., 8th Cav. killed two VC in two contacts; one was killed 12 miles west of Tam Ky, in the dense jungle, and the other was killed in a rice paddy 11½ miles southwest of Tam Ky.

Co. B, 4-31 Inf. engaged two VC killing one in a mountainous region 22 miles west-northwest of Tam Ky.

Co. A, 1-46 Inf. engaged three VC in triple-canopy jungle eight miles southwest of Tam Ky, who broke contact and escaped through the jungle. During a search of the area an SKS rifle and a Chicom type 53 carbine were found.

Nine of the 10 VC killed in the 1st Sqdn., 1st Cav. area were killed by gunships.

"Blue Ghost" gunships of F Trp., 8th Cav. killed six VC in five contacts within a half mile of each other in rice paddies 10 miles northwest of Tam Ky. Three more VC were killed along the coast, one killed seven miles north and two killed 10 miles north of Tam Ky.

A Trp., 1st Cav. killed a lone VC in a rice paddy eight miles west-northwest of Tam Ky.

GENEVA PARK and RUSSELL BEACH--One VC was killed and a weapon captured in the 198th Inf. Bde. area Monday.

Co. B, 1-52 Inf. engaged four VC killing one and detaining a wounded VC suspect in foothills seven miles northwest of Quang Ngai in Operation Geneva Park.

In Operation Russell Beach, Co. A, 5-46 Inf. spotted four VC sitting around a camp fire at 0530 hours, and engaged them. The VC ran into a tunnel and out another exit before the company blew the tunnel up. A M-16 rifle was found during a search of the area 9½ miles northeast of Quang Ngai, on the Batangan Peninsula.

IRON MOUNTAIN--No enemy kills were reported in the 11th Inf. Bde. area where four enemy suspects were detained.

The recon patrol of the 1-20 Inf. detained two enemy suspects during a search of an area seven miles northwest of Duc Pho.

Co. A, 3-1 Inf. detained two more suspects near the coast four miles southeast of Duc Pho.

Thirteen Americal soldiers were wounded and evacuated for medical treatment, according to an initial report.

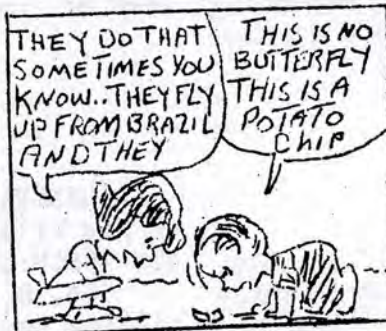
