

COMBAT

During the period this Company has operated out in the area of operation, the use of saturation patrols over an extensive area produces more kills than having the unit in a company formation. At night the platoons pull into a company perimeter. Also Cordon and Search has been very successful in some instances where it is known that Viet Cong Guerrillas move into a village at night and leave just prior to day break. Normally the company moves in early in the morning and Cordon off the village at the first light a platoon moves through the village and pushes the Viet Cong into the waiting trap of the other platoons.

With the excellent Helicopter support wounded personnel are evacuated to Brigade Clearing Station. Even in the hours of darkness air evacuation has been accomplished with much success.

CORAL SANDS II

The company departed from Schofield Barracks at approximately 1630 hours on the 1st of August 1967. We were transported to the Honolulu Transportation Terminal (Pier 40) by motor convoy. The first night of our movement was spent aboard the vessel, the U.S.S. Navarro APA 215, an attack troop carrier.

We left Honolulu on the day after our arrival at approximately 1500 hours. Once aboard the vessel life was not a complete standstill. The company underwent "wet net" training, man overboard, and abandon ship procedures. Physical training was also included in our on board training. Morale, to say the least, was at a very high point.

We arrived off Papohaku Beach on Molokai on the 5th of August 1967. At about 1400 hours on the same day we hit the beach which was held by the Viet Cong. The enemy at this point assimilated but later on in the problem very much in contention. The "enemy" was composed of the 100th Battalion, 442nd Infantry, U.S. Army Reserve and the 40th Special Forces Detachment.

To make the problem more of a true reality the U.S. Navy and The U.S. Air Force flew missions against the enemy. Artillery was also assimilated but was put to use very extensively in the 3 days that our company had encountered the enemy.

On the 7th of August 1967 our company pulled back to the beach line and later on back to our ship. We arrived just in time for hot chow and race for those showers.....

We returned to Honolulu on the 8th of August 1967 and after debarking the vessel were on our way back to Schofield.

The operation itself, was a not soon to be forgotten experience. The company definitely excelled in their performance of this exercise.



MORTAR PLATOON

The training we have accomplished in the 4.2 Platoon ranges from tactical and live fire to a classroom mortar school. The mortar school was a highlight for the Battalion, some of the very best training the Battalion or the Brigade for that matter was conducted in one accelerated week. The live fire portion of the training will pick up the morale of any mortarman, this is especially true in the 4.2 Platoon.

The personnel in Mortar Platoons are of a higher caliber than a line soldier, but in the heavy Mortar Platoon we try to get the best men in the Battalion the average G.T. score in the 4.2 Platoon is 128. compared with 100 in a line Company. We also have one college grad, SP4 Orera, Sgt Defeo, PFC Gent, PFC Oleson PFC Williams, SP4 Yanes have 14 years education, SP4 Ferguson, PFC Buehner, PFC Rutherford, PFC Smith, SP4 Hicks, and PFC Butler also have college background.

Each man has proved his exceptional ability to adjust live rounds in record time. Being an FO also takes a keen mind, you must know the tactical situation and especially where you are on the map, the most important piece of information an infantry soldier can have. The FO also must maintain a high degree of physical excellence, his job is a strenuous one. The eyes of our Platoon are SP4 Riley, SP4 Bell, PFC Butler, PFC Semczyszyn, PFC Wright, SP4 Hicks, SP4 Ferguson, and PFC Stemmler.

The brain of the Platoon is the FDC, Chief computeris SGT Defeo, he is responsible for all that takes place in the computing of a mission, his right arm man is SGT Malecky. SGT Malecky came to the Platoon from the Recon Platoon. Through his ability to grasp and retain technical information he has become a very vital portion of the Platoon. SGT Malecky has written articles for a national firearms magazine, and plans to work as an officer in the fire department after he completes his Military obligation. Next in FDC we have PFC Buehner a good computer and also the platoon barber, a man everyone likes, especially his discount haircuts. The RTO and driver is PFC Oleson, he has worked in FDC from the time he was assigned to the unit. He is also a very good Computer. Initiative, brains and desire has made our FDC the best.

1. INTRODUCTION

The 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry was reactivated on 1 July 1966 as an organic part of the Army's 11th Infantry Brigade, and thus brought the total to three battalions of the 1st Infantry that are currently on active duty. The locations of these three battalions are:

1st Battalion, 1st Infantry - Assigned to USMA West Point, New York.

2nd Battalion, 1st Infantry - Assigned to the 196th Light Infantry Brigade, currently serving in the Republic of Vietnam.

3d Battalion, 1st Infantry - Assigned to the 11th Infantry Brigade, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii.

With its activation, 3d Battalion looked towards its future task, the mission it would be expected to accomplish, and the many hours of preparation it would take to accomplish this requirement, not just satisfactorily, but with the superior quality that is expected of any unit in the First Infantry.

2. MISSION AND RESOURCES:

A. Mission: The mission of the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry is simply stated as, "Act as the Pacific Reserve and be prepared to move by sea or air any place, any time."

B. Capabilities: 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry possesses the capabilities to engage in all forms of guerrilla warfare, and is prepared to move to Southeast Asia on a moment's notice. Being especially trained for these types of operations and well adapted to jungle terrain does not limit the Battalion to just that specific area. They are also well versed in conventional warfare and can assume any role (tactical) no matter what the location might be!

D. Vehicles and Equipment: At present, we have all our vehicles and TOE equipment, less starlight scopes.

E. Facilities: There were new additions in Quad B to include:

1. Soft Drink, Ice Cream and Candy Machines throughout
2. Tailor Shop
3. Laundry
4. PX
5. Snack Bar

F. Organization: On 14 August 1967, the Battalion was re-organized from the old TOE to the new TOE, giving us a more flexible Battalion. Instead of having 3 Rifle Companies and a Headquarters Company, under the new TOE we have 4 Rifle Companies, a Combat Support Company, and a Headquarters Company.

3. OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

A. Training Exercises: 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry began moving to PTA on 10 February, and with this move, were to begin preparation for the Company Army Training Test. During the months of February and March, the Battalion underwent an extensive training program, which saw all three companies successfully pass the Company Army Training Test and undertake the first Battalion-size PTX. The successful completion of the Company ATT left only the Battalion ATT, and training of the 3d Rifle Platoons which hadn't yet arrived.

B. Operations Readiness Exercises: The quality of personnel, both in leadership and accomplishment of assigned task, became evident when the 3d Battalion was selected to be the first combat-ready Battalion of the 11th Infantry Brigade. Upon reaching this status, we began to receive all the necessary equipment to implement this program.

C. Coral Sands II: The Battalion underwent strenuous and enduring training in preparation for the Coral Sands II Exercise on the Island of Molekai, approximately 26 miles from our base camp (Schofield Barracks). The majority of training previous to this movement included insurgency and counterinsurgency tactics, care and maintenance and waterproofing of equipment, weapons, and vehicles, supply procedures, mobility, camouflage, field sanitation and patrolling. Also included in this training was "dry net" training. This was of great importance especially with the experience we were to have on the ship via "wet net" training. The Battalion departed Schofield Barracks at approximately 1630 hours on the 1st of August 1967. We were transported to the Honolulu Transportation Terminal (Pier 40) by motor convey. The first night of our movement was spent aboard the vessel, USS Navarro APA 215, an Attack Troop Carrier. We left Honolulu on the day after our arrival at approximately 1500 hours. Once aboard ship, life was not at a complete standstill. The Battalion underwent "wet net" training, man overboard, and abandon ship procedures. Physical training was also included in our on-board training. Morale was at a very high point. We arrived off Papehaku Beach on Molekai on the 5th of August 1967. At 1400 hours on the same day we hit the beach which was held by the Viet Cong. The "enemy" was composed of the 100th Battalion, 442d Infantry, US Army Reserve and the 40th Special Forces Detachment.

C. (Con't): To make the problem more of a true reality, the US Navy and the US Air Force flew missions against the enemy. Artillery was also assimilated but was put to use very extensively in the 3 days that the Battalion encountered the enemy. On the 7th of August 1967, the Battalion pulled back to the beach line and later on back to the ship. The Battalion returned to Honolulu on the 8th of August 1967 and, after debarking the vessel, were on the way back to Schofield Barracks. The operation itself was not soon to be forgotten as an experience. The Battalion definitely excelled in their performance of this exercise.

D. ATT's: Once a large enough quantity of personnel had arrived, each company received an adequate amount of troops to fill one rifle platoon. Upon filling these platoons, the next hurdle was training, and its inherent problems. First, the individual soldier's military knowledge must be refreshed, then it must be planted firmly in his mind so that his actions become habit and reactions become reflex. Progression to a higher degree of training followed as individuals became squad members, and at first there was total confusion, then correlation, and the finished product was a combat ready rifle squad. Again, a hurdle was passed, the completion of Squad Army Training Test, and training stepped up one more level to the rifle platoon. Precise coordination, a must, was the goal and with it, the successful completion of the 1st Platoon Army Training Test. Through hard work and long hours all these goals were met and in keeping with tradition, also accomplished in a superior manner. During the latter part of this same period, the second platoons began to repeat the very same training cycle, so that by the end of December, one rifle platoon had completed training and the other was well on its way to completion. The completion of the Battalion ATT's in late June, 1967, and the superior performance by members of the Battalion during the conduct of the Army Training Test attests to the fact that we, the present members of the 3rd Battalion, 1st Infantry are, "Always First" and above all, prepared to fight anytime, any place.

E. Jungle Warfare Training: Returning from Pohakuloa Area brought about the reconditioning of JGWTC, it was soon learned that the remaining personnel to fill the Battalion would be arriving. Many would not have finished AIT and would have to be trained. Because of the already heavy work-load on the Battalion, one of the other Infantry Battalions began to train all of our newly arrived personnel

E. (Con't): in Advanced Individual Training. Jungle Guerrilla Warfare Training Center became the Battalion's next project. Again, "Always First" prevailed with the 3rd Battalion becoming the first complete Battalion to finish training at the center. The varied subjects taught were: Ambush and Counter-Ambush, Water Crossing, survival, etc. 3d Battalion's first official role in the JGWTC was to demonstrate Ambush and Counter-Ambush techniques to a group of visiting Thai Officers, with this completed, the Battalion had become the first unit of the 11th Infantry Brigade to conduct training operations, and the first Army unit since the departure of the 25th Infantry Division to Vietnam. 3d Battalion, and specifically, Company C, received many favorable comments on the conduct of the demonstration, and the superior performance by members of the Battalion was rewarded by giving them two additional demonstrations to conduct. As the first, the other two demonstrations were of superior quality, and a direct reflection on the professionalism that is shown by the Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers, and Enlisted Men of the Battalion. It must be remembered, however, that the course was designed only to give a stable working knowledge and not to produce a highly skilled jungle fighter.

F. TRAINFIRE AND MARKSMANSHIP: Jan 1967 - The Battalion received the M16 Rifle and proceeded with a Zero and Marksmanship Training Program. Feb-Oct - Refresher training was accomplished by those personnel who had previously qualified in January, and there was marksmanship for replacements. Nov - The new M16A1 was issued to the Battalion and an extensive Marksmanship Program was set up prior to our deployment to the Republic of Vietnam.

G. MISSION ACCOMPLISHMENTS: The mission of being prepared to move by sea or air, any time, any place, was accomplished by the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry when we deployed to the Republic of Vietnam.

IV. SPECIAL EVENTS:

A. Pahakuloa Training Area: The progress of the Battalion spoke for itself when it moved to the Pahakuloa Training Area. The successful completion of all the training missions along with the distinction of being the first battalion of the 11th Infantry Brigade to train in the area and also conduct its first Battalion-size FTX. This was an important occurrence since all three rifle companies had just completed the Army Training Test. Now was the time to iron out any small problems, and to effect a link with the companies so that corrections could be made and minimize the difficulties on further operations. The Battalion added two more first before returning by completion of Company ATT's and conducting the first Battalion-size FTX.

B. Annual Inspector General Inspection: The Annual Inspector General Inspection was held in June of 1967. The Battalion was rated satisfactorily by US Army Hawaii, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. This, of course, was in standing with the Battalion motto of "ALWAYS FIRST." There were minor deficiencies noted, however, these were almost all corrected by on-the-spot supervision by the Inspection Team.
