The 6th Division, including the First Infantry was reactivated 4 October 1950 at Fort Ord, California. There it remained, training troops and personnel for the Korean Conflict. On 3 April 1956 the 6th Division was again deactivated, however, the colors of the First Infantry were transferred to West Point, New York where the regiment became a TD unit training the United States Corps of Cadets.

At 0900 hours, 1 July 1966, at Candy Field, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, the 11th Infantry Brigade was activated. Among the Battalions of the 11th Infantry Brigade was the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry (Always First) commanded by Lieutenant Colonel Charles W. Zuppann. During the Activation Ceremonies, Lieutenant Colonel Charles W. Zuppann received the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry Colors from Lieutenant General Edgar C. Doleman, Chief of Staff, USARPAC. The 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry is presently located at Schofield Barracks just outside of a town called Wahiawa on beautiful Oahu. Schofield Barracks sits almost right in the middle of the island between two mountain ranges. The climate is moderate with seasonal rain. The training area offered by the island is excellent for squad and platoon size training.

The heritage of the First Infantry is a proud one. The present members of the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry are dedicated to adding another worthy chapter to this illustrious history.

1. MISSION: The mission of the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry, as a part of the 11th Infantry Brigade is to "Act as the Pacific Reserve and be Prepared to Move by Air or Sea and Fight Anywhere, Anytime".

2. CAPABILITIES: The capabilities of the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry have been limited because of a slow input of personnel. However, considering the caliber officers and NCO's the unit would be able to fulfill its mission if called upon to do so.

3. PERSONNEL: The key slots in the Battalion were filled with the arrival of Major Frank O. Gould, the Battalion Executive Officer. Key positions in the Battalion were filled as follows:

4. VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT: On 4 August 1966 the first TOE equipment, consisting of 100 M-14 Rifles, were issued to the Battalion. By 29 August the Battalion has received its authorized amount of 591 M-14's. Prior to September 1966, the equipment was coming into the Battalion at a slow rate; however, starting 7 September 1966 the equipment started rolling in by the truck loads. Some of the major items in this increased flow of equipment were crew served weapons, organizational clothing and equipment, .45 cal pistols, telephones, radio sets, tool kits, switchboards, test sets, food containers, vehicles, and trailers. By 10 December 1966 the Battalion had approximately 81% of its authorized weapons on hand. On 13 December a big change came with the arrival of the M-16 Rifles, which became the basic weapon for the men of the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry. Vehicle wise

we reached the 64% mark by 31 December 1966. Still missing were over one-half of our 2 1/2 ton trucks, 30 of our 3/4 ton trucks, and the 5 ton wrecker. The way the equipment was arriving it was anticipated that the 100% mark would be reached by 1 February 1967.

5. FACILITIES: The members of the Battalion are housed in one half of Quad C at Schofield Barracks. Our portion of the Quad can accommodate 750 persons, with the officers, senior NCO's, and married NCO's living in post quarters, which makes the living conditions for the men extremely good. The post housing which is offered to the married personnel, is more than adequate, consisting mostly of three room, two-story houses. The Bachelor Officer Quarters are among the best the Army has to offer. These apartment type quarters consist of a large living room, a bathroom, two large sized bedrooms, and a kitchen equipped with a stove and a refrigerator.

1. UNIT PROMOTIONS:

Promotions for the members of the Battalion come hard and individuals must prove beyond a doubt that they are qualified to hold a higher rank. After they have proven themselves to their Company Commanders they must appear before a promotion board which consist of the Battalion Executive Officer, Battalion Sergeant Major, and the Company Commanders. The board is by no means one where you can fake your way through and hope to be selected for promotion. With the qualifications as hard as they are, the following named members of this Battalion proved that they are worthy of promotion:

2. UNITED FUND DRIVE:

The Battalion was called upon to participate in the United Fund Drive on 14 September 1966, and less than a month later reached a goal of 100% participation. Again the spirit of the members of this Battalion is to be commended. There are a few members however, who deserve credit for the Battalion reaching the 100% mark. They are Lieutenant Paul Place, the Battalion Project Officer; Lieutenant Gerry Magee, Headquarters Company Project Officer; Lieutenant Randall Lundeen, A Company Project Officer; Lieutenant Norman Sawicki, B Company Project Officer; and Lieutenant Marshall Jones, C Company Project Officer. These officers spent much of their duty time, as well as off-duty time, explaining exactly what the United Fund represented and what it did, to the members of the Battalion.

1. PRE-CYCLE TRAINING: On 7 August the men of the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry began pre-cycle training. The first training schedule covered the week of 8 through 14 August 1966, just a little over a month after the unit was activated. The first scheduled class commenced at 0730 hours 10 August 1966, the subject being Unit History, presented by 2LT Robert Trimble. The first two weeks were devoted to basic military subjects, i.e.; Military Courtesy, First Aid, General Orders, Code of Conduct, Military Justice, Map Reading, and Organization of the 11th Infantry Brigade, and squad and platoon drill. With these and many more basic subjects still fresh in the minds of the men, pre-cycle training took a swing towards subjects like, squad formations and battle drill, patrolling, and platoon formations and battle drill. A large amount of time during the pre-cycle training phase was allotted to materiel readiness. On 12 September 1966, the Battalion started training in MOS fields. Lt Clyde Bonner was the principle instructor for the 106 mm Recoilless Rifle personnel. Under his instruction the men learned general characteristics, disassembly and assembly, functioning, safety features, stoppages and immediate action drill, crew drill, ammunition, care and cleaning, positions, tracking exercises, and other fundamentals of the 106mm Recoilless Rifle. Lt Harry Rhinehart instructed the 81mm Mortar personnel on the basic fundamentals of the gun. Under the expert instruction of Lt John Nolan, on the 4.2 Mortar, Lt Gordon Evans on the 90mm Recoilless Rifle, and Lt Randall Lundeen on the M60 Machinegun, the members of the 3d Battalion, 1st

Infantry became well qualified and trained on their respective weapons. With the completion of the pre-cycle training and MOS training, on 9 October 1966, the officers and men were well prepared to start their next phase of training, Basic Unit Training.

2. BASIC UNIT TRAINING: Squad training started on 10 October 1966, for the men of this battalion. This phase of training was started with an ambush and counter ambush demonstration for the Brigade by the members of Company C, 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry, under the supervision of Captain George T. Bell. During the next few weeks the men found themselves in the field training to function as a team. During this extensive training they prepared for their squad Army Training Tests.

a. SQUAD ARMY TRAINING TESTS: Upon completion of basic unit training the members of the Battalion were ready for their respective squad Army Training Tests. The Army Training Test consisted of three (3) phases: daylight attack, defense, and night combat patrol. The first to take the test was SSG Bailey, 1st Squad Leader, 1st Platoon, Company A on 2 November 1966. SSG Bailey's squad achieved a score of 82% which placed his squad eighth out of the nine squads tested. The lowest score achieved was an 81% obtained by the 2d Squad, 1st Platoon, Company C, under the supervision of SSG Kelly. The highest score obtained of the nine (9) squads was a 93%, obtained by the 3d Squad, 1st Platoon, Company C, under the supervision of SGT Beardon. The scores, even the lowest of 81%, speak

for themselves as to the caliber training the members of the Battalion received in preparation for their tests. The squads of the 2d platoon's started their tests on 14 December 1966. The lowest score obtained was 75% by the 3d Squad, 2d Platoon, Company C, under the leadership of SGT Battle. The highest score was a 91% achieved by 3d Squad, 2d Platoon, Company B, under SSG Sparks and 2d Squad, 2d Platoon, Company A, under the leadership of SGT Lester. With all the squads passing their squad Army Training Test, the platoons were ready to start their platoon training.

b. PLATOON ARMY TRAINING TESTS: With the completion of platoon training, the rifle platoon Army Training Test was at hand. The first platoon to get a crack at it was the first platoon of Company A under the leadership of Lt Robert Bush, who assumed command of the platoon on 10 August 1966. The results of the 5 December 1966 test found the platoon with a numerical score of 83.4%, that the platoon could effectively function and maintain itself for sustained operational periods, and that the platoon is physically fit to perform in combat. Next to participate in the test was the platoon of Lt Robert Trimble, Company B, who assumed command on 12 August 1966. On 6 December 1966 his platoon achieved a score of 80.2% and was also rated as being combat ready. On 7 December 1966 the platoon of Lt Clyde Bonner, 1st Platoon, Company C, got a chance to show their stuff. The platoon achieved a numerical score of 80%, as well as being declared physically and mentally able to perform in combat.

c. PLATOON LEADERS EXERCISE: After completion of their ATT's, the platoon leaders really got their chance to show their stuff. At 0700 hours on 13 December 1966, the 1st Platoon, Company C, under Lt Clyde Bonner, embarked on the "Summit Trail Walk". This exercise required the platoon to start on Wikane Trail in the east range area and move to Kauka A in less than three days. The 1st Platoon, Company B under Lt Robert Trimble, departed at 0930 hours, 13 December 1966, 1st Platoon, Company A, departed at 1200 hours, 13 December 1966. The Recon Platoon departed at 1430 hours, 13 December 1966. The problem itself was set up so that the respective platoon leaders were required to make check points for resupply at certain times. Each of the platoons in the battalion who participated reached their destination in more than enough time and finding the men in very high spirit. "First Infantry - Always First"

4. MISSIONS ACCOMPLISHED:

The mission of the 3d Battalion, 1st Infantry was to have all of its full platoons combat ready by the end of the year. These platoons included the first rifle platoon of each company, the different sections of the weapons platoon, the 4.2 Inch Mortar Platoon, and the Reconnaissance Platoon. Through the training phases there was not too much doubt that this goal would soon become a fact. As the scores of the Army Training Tests have indicated, yesterday's goals are today's facts.
